Lenten Class with Pastor Adam
“Exercising Power in Tumultuous Times”

We live in a nation divided. The combination of political unrest, the degradation of truth and ethics, and the influence of Christian Nationalism have created a social climate that is difficult to navigate as disciples of Jesus Christ. The question many of us are asking is “How can we live out our Christian faith in the middle of all the chaos?”

Jesus lived in a chaotic and broken world too. He had a way about him that stood apart from the ‘ways of the world.’ This way of Jesus centered around Jesus’ understanding and exercising of power. “Almost every single story – from his birth to death to resurrection – reveals an inversion of the world’s understanding of power” (Escobar, Kathy. Turning Over Tables, pg. 11). Jesus disrupted existing power structures in his countercultural ministry where he cared for those on the margins of society. Jesus touched lepers; ate with outcasts and sinners; chose non-violence; said the first were last and the last first and that the greatest among us is the servant. He told the truth, respected and valued all others, and led with compassion and empathy. Jesus showed the world a way to exercise power.

This Lent, I will be teaching a weekly class where we will be examining ‘power’ and how it can be used in unhealthy ways: toward division, destruction, and self-interest, but also in healthy ways: building community, raising up the lowly, sharing hope, and selfless giving. ‘Unhealthy power (power over) is centered on fear, hierarchy, scarcity, and being right, while healthy power (power with/to/within) is built on empathy, expansion, and connection’ (Brene Brown).

We all have power. It’s not good or bad. But what we choose to do with the power we have is what matters. And regardless of what is going on around us, we still have a choice in how we exercise our own power and how we respond to the unhealthy use of power throughout the world.

I want to invite you to join me every Thursday from 6-7:30 p.m. in the Christensen room beginning March 13th and going through April 17th (with the only exception of Thursday, March 27th, when we will not meet) where we will explore ‘power’ together through scripture, stories, and several resources. There will be plenty of opportunities for discussion and dialogue as well as your questions. And if that’s not enough, I also invite you to bring a dish to share! We’ll begin with a potluck meal at each gathering. Even if you cannot bring a dish, don’t let that stop you from coming. God will provide plenty of food for us all.

My friends, I look forward to jumping into this Lenten season together. See you on Thursdays!

2025 PRESBYTERIAN YOUTH TRIENNIUM




Every three years, the Presbyterian Church USA offers an incredible opportunity for high school youth from around the world to come together in one place and one time for worship, fellowship, service, and fun! This opportunity is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for our youth. I still remember when I participated in the Presbyterian Youth Triennium (PYT) as a senior in high school. It was at that event that Christ strengthened my faith. I built fantastic, meaningful relationships. And, you might say, God moved me in new directions and toward the path that God had intended for my life all along. I probably wouldn't be the pastor I am today without PYT. And so, as you might imagine, I am thrilled to be one of the co-leaders for our delegation this year.

PYT will be held in Louisville, Kentucky from July 28 to 31. Seven youth and I will be embarking from PCN to join seven more youth and adults from other churches from all around our Presbytery to form one Redwoods Presbytery delegation. Together, we will come together in the name of Jesus Christ with 6,000 Presbyterian youth from around the world, to be the church together.

As you can imagine, PYT costs quite a bit of money for our youth to attend. Redwoods Presbytery has already committed to covering about one-third of the cost of this trip. Traditionally, the other two-thirds were covered by the church (1/3) and by participants (1/3). Our goal at PCN is to work toward covering the full two-thirds cost for all of our youth and leaders who feel called to attend. To that end, our youth will be doing several fundraisers over the next few months. I want to encourage everyone at PCN to consider giving and giving generously so that we can support our youth in this transformational endeavor. I truly believe this is an investment for the future of our youth but also the church. When we return, stay tuned for a full report from our youth participants as they share about their experience.

In the meantime, I invite you to begin praying for our delegation as we make plans. Pray for Annelise and Tennyson McMickin, Ellis and Weston Stahley, and Aaron, Kaydence, and Zachary Smith, and this pastor.




Winter/Spring 2025 PCN Adult Learning Opportunity

PCN elder Walt Campbell is moderating a Great Courses video lecture and discussion group on “Biblical History and Archaeology” via Zoom on Saturday mornings from 10:30 a.m. to noon. The lecturer for the class is Dr. Jean-Pierre Disbouts, a professor of history at Fielding Graduate University. The video lectures are co-produced by The Great Courses and National Geographic. The course content addresses cultural sharing among ancient civilizations using literary texts and archaeological findings to gain insight into Biblical texts and the evolution of Judeo-Christian traditions from the creation accounts of Genesis to the spread of Christianity in the Roman Empire.

The course will consist of 24 half-hour lectures to be viewed over 12 weeks, from February 22 to May 10. Participants will receive a pdf copy of a written course guide, a weekly email with suggested group discussion questions, and credentials to stream make-up sessions from the Great Courses website. 
