### **Pregnancy** Care Center

On September 28, 482 guests attended our annual banquet grossing the largest amount ever raised, **\$131,570**! Our keynote speaker was Dr. Marc Newman, a pro-life apologetics expert and founder/president of Speaker for Life. In addition to being our keynote, Dr. Newman spoke at our Pastors' Reception just prior to the banquet.

This year, as of October, we had **298** client visits with **1,847** return visits. We gave **224** pregnancy tests, conducted **1,606** peer-counseling, **797** material assistance with **1,399** Earn While You Learn class visits. But most importantly, we welcomed **64** precious babies.

Our new Sexual Risk Avoidance curriculum has been approved by Wilson County. We are waiting for the Metro Nashville committee to set a date for their approval meeting.

TGBC's Women on Mission Sisters have been focusing on the Pregnancy Care Center this fall. They provided several baby items in November for the PCC Boutique where PCC clients will use points that they earn by attending classes to purchase items they need.

In December, WoM Sisters will tour the new Lebanon PCC location and provide new toys for the children's areas in both Old Hickory and Lebanon. This is an excellent opportunity to learn more about this ministry!

### **Dodson** Elementary

Volunteers from Tulip Grove have been busy at Dodson Elementary since the start of school. Each week we help **distribute weekend food bags** to students in need at the school, including several students who are classified as homeless. This can range anywhere from "doubling up" in an apartment or home with other family members, to living in a hotel, to living in a vehicle. Food bags are provided each week by the Bridge Ministry, and volunteers from Tulip Grove get them to the students who need them. We have been averaging just under 130 bags per week.

We have volunteered each month at the **Dodson Market** attendance store. Shoppers earn "dollars" to spend for household and personal care items for each day that their student is on time and stays for the entire day. Many students have missed at least 10 school days so far this year, and it is hoped the store will encourage better attendance.

In October we provided a light breakfast to parents and families at **Awards Day**. Parents and siblings enjoyed delicious donuts from Gourmet Donuts in Mt. Juliet, as they came to watch their children receive awards.

Malcolm Helton and Dan Gant **built a ramp** to the portable which houses the Dodson Market, which enables easy access for carts and wagons that transport items back and forth between the portable and the main school building.

There are many opportunities to serve at Dodson, including needs for **tutors**, which range from working with flashcards to helping with upper-level math. **Classroom volunteers** are always needed to assist teachers. After Christmas, the school hopes to begin a **Lunch Buddies** program, where volunteers will be assigned an at-risk student to have lunch with on a regular basis. And we are praying that the Lord will provide workers to start a new **Good News Club** at the beginning of next school year.

### **Rest Stop** Ministries

Rest Stop Ministries (RSM) is a not-for-profit, faith-based organization in the Nashville area dedicated to comprehensively restoring female survivors of domestic sex trafficking. RSM follows a housing-first model and provides holistic survivor-centered, trauma-informed care in a long-term residential community. RSM partners locally with End Slavery Tennessee as their primary referral agency but also accept other referrals such as Rescue 1 Global.

In 2021, RSM launched a social enterprise that supports both the financial independence of their graduates and the sustainability of their program. Their residential program at Good Hope Farms can house up to seven residents for their 18-month program. Graduates of their program have the option to continue to receive support through RSM's alumni program.

TGBC Women on Mission have volunteered with RSM since they spoke at TGBC's Human Trafficking Awareness event in 2017. Current volunteers include Renee Mathis, Lani Bruce, Janice LaRoy, and Nancy Miller. Mission projects have included life-skills classes such as cooking, cake/cookie decorating, and arts and crafts. Other volunteer opportunities include organizing clothing closets, writing thank you notes to donors, and gardening.

Lani Bruce volunteers regularly with RSM and is planning the RSM missions projects for our January 2 and February 6 meetings. The February meeting will have a Valentine theme, and the March 5 meeting will have an Easter theme.

We will end our RSM focus with our April 2 meeting and a field trip to RSM's Good Hope Farms facility. Janice LaRoy who also volunteers regularly with RSM is coordinating our April missions project to help organize RSM's extensive clothing closets.

Our last WoM Sisters meeting for this church year will be at Five Oaks in Lebanon to celebrate our year and start planning for the fall.

In January, the GAs and RAs will have an International Mission Study night Friday, January 12, 6-9pm to learn how the gospel is being shared in Zambia, a beautiful country in Africa famous for its unique landscape and the Zambezi River. Our GAs and RAs will explore ways they can pray for and become involved with missions in Zambia.
