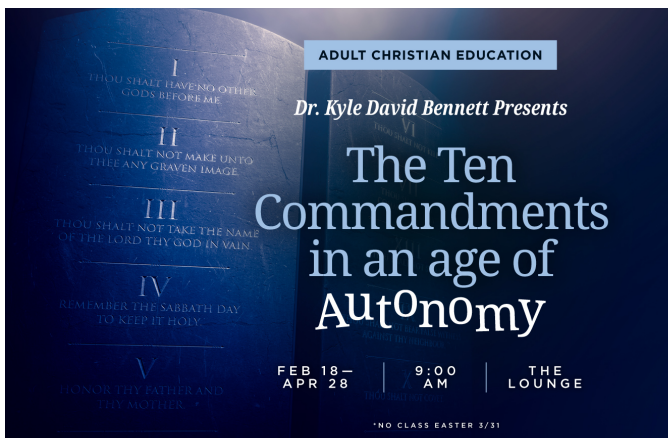

The Christian East African Economic Development (CEED) has let us know that our donation has been used to drill a well in western Uganda.

According to a letter received from Rev. Wilson Atuhire of the Katikengeye Archdeaconry,

*“I write to express our sincere and heartfelt appreciation for this sacrificial donation of a water source that has been our greatest problem for over years. Many of our people have been spending a lot of money on sicknesses caused by taking contaminated water and much of the time, we would travel big distances in search for safe and clean water. This resulted in many challenges namely; school drop outs, accidents and poverty due to buying water on a daily basis. With this water source, we are no safe. We give glory to God who used your kind heart to help. God bless you always.”*

### **Scripture especially to be considered for potential Elders:**

*Titus 1:5-9*

*An elder must be blameless, faithful to his wife, a man whose children believe and are not open to the charge of being wild and disobedient. Since an overseer manages God’s household, he must be blameless—not overbearing, not quick-tempered, not given to drunkenness, not violent, not pursuing dishonest gain. Rather, he must be hospitable, one who loves what is good, who is self-controlled, upright, holy and disciplined. He must hold firmly to the trustworthy message as it has been taught, so that he can encourage others by sound doctrine and refute those who oppose it.*

*I Timothy 3:1-7*

*“If anyone aspires to the office of overseer, he desires a noble task. Therefore an overseer must be above reproach, the husband of one wife, sober-minded, self-controlled, respectable, hospitable, able to teach, not a drunkard, not violent but gentle, not quarrelsome, not a lover of money. He must manage his own household well, with all dignity keeping his children submissive, for if someone does not know how to manage his own household, how will he care for God’s church? He must not be a recent convert, or he may become puffed up with conceit and fall into the condemnation of the devil. Moreover, he must be well thought of by outsiders, so that he may not fall into disgrace, into a snare of the devil.”*

### **Scripture especially to be considered for potential Deacons:**

*1 Timothy 3:8–13*

*“Deacons likewise must be dignified, not double-tongued, not addicted to much wine, not greedy for dishonest gain. They must hold the mystery of the faith with a clear conscience. And let them also be tested first; then let them serve as deacons if they prove themselves blameless. Their wives likewise must be dignified, not slanderers, but sober-minded, faithful in all things. Let deacons each be the husband of one wife, managing their children and their own households well. For those who serve well as deacons gain a good standing for themselves and also great confidence in the faith that is in Christ Jesus.”*
