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Gossip: Destroyer of Trust

Pastor Matthew Mitchell's book, Resisting Gossip, defines gossip as "bearing bad news behind someone's back out of a bad heart" (Mitchell, 23). In his research for the book, he quotes the writer of Proverbs in the Old Testament as evidence of the destructive nature of gossip. Both Proverbs 18:8 and 26:22 state: "The words of a gossip are like choice morsels; they go down to the inmost parts." But what makes gossip a choice morsel? What makes it so enticing and "tasty?" It's the difference between junk food and healthy food.

Mitchell explains, "'choice morsels' are tasty things we want to devour quickly. They are the best, most attractive, most addictive things to eat. They are like a bowl of potato chips left on the kitchen counter. ... What happens if you eat the whole bowl before supper all by yourself? Unless you have the constitution of an ox, you're probably going to feel sick" (Mitchell, 22). This is what gossip is like. It looks good, it sounds good, it may even taste good, but in the end, it always leaves us feeling sick and guilty.

Gossip has no beneficial value. It may feel good or sound good in the moment, but it always leaves us empty. Not to mention the effect it has on others and the one toward whom the gossip is directed. The pain and the breakdown of trust are devastating. Like a wildfire burning through acres of land leaving only ash and destruction in its wake, so gossip leaves a barren wasteland of destruction in relationships, groups, and communities. James in his letter to the church in the New Testament attests to the fact that the tongue is a very dangerous thing. He writes, "among all the parts of the body, the tongue is a flame of fire. It is a whole world of wickedness, corrupting your entire body. It can set your whole life on fire, for it is set on fire by hell itself."

This month, we will be considering the devastating effects of gossip on faithfulness and trust within relationships by learning to recognize what it is, resisting it, responding to it appropriately, and putting and end to it. Mitchell reminds us as believers that we are to "flow in a different direction than those in the world" (151), and this includes the way we talk and what we say about others. The end of gossip is the beginning of trust.

saia 117 Community Partnership Highlight

Isaiah 117 House provides physical and emotional support in a safe and loving home for children awaiting placement. When children are removed from their homes out of concern for their safety, they are usually brought to a child welfare services office to await placement. This wait can be a few hours to several days. These children often have nothing with them and are scared, lonely, hungry, and in dirty clothing. Isaiah 117 provides a comforting home where these children instead can be brought to wait – a place that is safe with friendly and loving volunteers who provide clean clothes, smiles, toys, and snuggly blankets. This space allows children to receive the comfort and care they need while child welfare staff can do the necessary paperwork and identify a good placement. The mission of Isaiah 117 House is threefold: reduce trauma for children awaiting placement lighten the load for child welfare services ease the transition for foster families.
