Respectable Sins

We too often categorize sin into "really bad" and "not so bad" categories. Sins like sexual immorality, murder, and stealing would fall into the category of "really bad," whereas sins like jealousy, selfishness, and pride tend to fall into the "not so bad" category. But why do we do this? Why do we rank sins differently? If all sin separates us from GOD, then why do some diminish the severity of some over others?

Over the next two months at North Main, we will be exploring the "lesser" sins that seem "not so bad" in order to see their damaging effects on relationships, the body of Christ, and the individual. Here is a list of the "respectable sins" we will be covering: selfishness, jealousy, judgmentalism, anger, anxiety, and worldliness.

I'm guessing that as you read the previous list, you may have grimaced. You might have even been frustrated or offended. Maybe, just maybe, you are in disagreement with some of the things on that list. However, I assure you that these things are contrary to faith and a life lived in submission to Christ and His teachings. Though no one is perfect, it's important to remember that we are works in progress. Though we might not be tempted by the so-called

"bigger" sins, most of us struggle with some of the "smaller" ones. And sadly, those "smaller" sins can be just as damaging as the "really bad" sins because they hold sway and control over us like painful, irritating splinters in our flesh, affecting our day-to-day life and our relationships.

Let's consider one of the more common "not so bad" sins: Anxiety. Anxiety and fear are directly tied to distrust. One of the main reasons that anxiety is a problem is that it causes us to doubt GOD's ability to come through for us.

Many, many people deal with anxiety, so much so that it has become a large part of the medical industry in the United States. Anti-anxiety medications are being prescribed more and more as anxiety disorders are on the rise (full disclosure, I struggle with this too!). But should we categorize anxiety as a sin? Jerry Bridges, in his book entitled *Respectable Sins*, writes, "When you or I say to someone, 'Don't be anxious' or 'Don't be afraid,' we are simply trying to encourage the person, or admonish in a helpful way. But when Jesus (or Paul or Peter, who were writing under divine inspiration) says to us, 'Don't be anxious,' it has the force of a moral command. In other words, it is the moral will of GOD that we not be anxious" (Bridges, 58).

I encourage you to lean into this new series with a willingness to learn and grow. Though it may hit close to home for most of us, I believe dealing with these things is important to living an abundant life in Christ.




