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## DIGGING DEEPER

- 1. When you hear the word "persecuted", what comes to mind?
- 2. It's likely we'll never lose our lives for our faith and faithfulness to Christ but what are some things we might lose as we follow Jesus?
- 3. Is it possible to live a righteous life, as biblically defined, and not experience opposition? What kind of compromises might we have to make for that to happen?
- 4. Galatians 5:11 says the cross is offensive. What are some of the consequences if we seek to share the Gospel and remove any possible offense?
- 5. Jesus said the blessing of being persecuted is the kingdom of heaven. Why is eternity in heaven worth any hardship or loss we may suffer while on earth?
- 6. Jesus calls us to rejoice and be glad when we are persecuted. Why is that so hard? Why is it so necessary?
- 7. In Matthew 5:43, Jesus directs us to pray for those who persecute us. Why is that so hard? Why is that so necessary?
- 8. I Corinthians 4:12 says our response to persecution is to endure it. What keeps you going when you're paying for following Jesus?
- 9. Jesus said in John 16:33 that we would have trouble in the world but that we would have peace in him. Amid challenges to our faith walk, how can we experience his peace?
