SCRIPTURE PASSAGES

1 Peter 1:1-12

GOOD NEWS IN THE MIDST OF EXILE

- Exiles may be unknown and unloved by the <u>world</u> but they are known and dearly loved by their <u>heavenly Father</u>
- God's power **protects** those who **possess** genuine faith
- An <u>eternal perspective</u> gives hope in the midst of <u>temporal problems</u>, <u>pain</u>, and <u>persecution</u>
- <u>Trials</u>, not <u>prosperity</u>, prove the genuineness of our faith
- We should not trivialize, overstate, or pursue suffering
- Angels long to understand the <u>Good News</u> of <u>Jesus</u>, yet many of us have grown bored and want to move past it as though it is <u>old news</u>
