## **DIGGING DEEPER**

- 1. **Read Matthew 5:10-11.** When Jesus uses the word "persecution," what sort of things come to mind? How did Jesus clarify things a bit in verse 11?
- 2. To the best of your knowledge, have you ever suffered a little or a lot for doing good or for living a righteous life in Christ?
- 3. Why do exiles often suffer persecution? How does this apply to our being exiles for Christ?
- 4. Why should facing opposition draw us closer to each other? What might hinder that from happening?

- 5. Why does greater spiritual intimacy between believers give us greater spiritual intimacy with God?
- 6. **Read I Peter 3:15.** This verse challenges us to be prepared to "give an answer for the hope that we have." How do we do that?
- 7. It does not seem that we are often asked about the hope we have. What might be some reasons?
- 8. The redemption of lost people requires some suffering on our part. What are some forms that might take?
