## **DIGGING DEEPER**

- 1. What does the author of Hebrews mean by "spurring one another on toward love and good deeds"? How does corporate worship help us achieve this? How does the anticipation of Christ's return shape our approach to corporate worship?
- 2. What is the connection between the conviction of sin and the worship of God in 1 Corinthians 14? What role does hospitality and clear communication of the Gospel play for unbelievers in our gatherings?
- 3. Isaiah's encounter with God led him to a deep sense of repentance and a clear call to be sent as God's messenger. How does genuine worship prepare us to embrace God's call to be ambassadors for Christ? What does it mean to respond to God's revelation with humility, repentance, and obedience? How can this model be a part of our worship experiences today?
- 4. In the context of worship-driven witness, what does it mean to be "sent" by God? How does our worship fuel our desire to share the Gospel with others? In what ways have you personally responded to God's call after an encounter with Him in worship? How does worship move you toward action?
- 5. How can we as individuals and as a church cultivate a worship environment that compels us to "go" and make disciples of all nations? What steps can you take today to live as an ambassador for Christ?
