

New Life Church Welcomes Our Guests Today!



Join us for a time of spiritual growth as we read, discuss and apply *Life Together* by Dietrich Bonhoeffer.

After his martyrdom at the hands of the Gestapo in 1945, Bonhoeffer continued his witness in the hearts of Christians around the world. His Letters and Papers from Prison became a prized testimony to Christian faith and courage, read by thousands.

In Life Together, Pastor Bonhoeffer discusses the experience of Christian community. This story of a unique fellowship in an underground seminary during the Nazi years reads like one of Paul's letters and is beneficial to us today in a world of increasing isolation and callousness, even within the church. It gives practical advice on how life together in Christ can be sustained in families and groups through the role of personal prayer, worship in common, everyday work, and Christian service. Life Together is bread for all who are hungry for the real life of Christian fellowship.

James 2:1-13, NIV

Favoritism Forbidden

2 My brothers and sisters, believers in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ must not show favoritism. ² Suppose a man comes into your meeting wearing a gold ring and fine clothes, and a poor man in filthy old clothes also comes in. ³ If you show special attention to the man wearing fine clothes and say, "Here's a good seat for you," but say to the poor man, "You stand there" or "Sit on the floor by my feet," ⁴ have you not discriminated among yourselves and become judges with evil thoughts?

⁵ Listen, my dear brothers and sisters: Has not God chosen those who are poor in the eyes of the world to be rich in faith and to inherit the kingdom he promised those who love him? ⁶ But you have dishonored the poor. Is it not the rich who are exploiting you? Are they not the ones who are dragging you into court? ⁷ Are they not the ones who are blaspheming the noble name of him to whom you belong?

⁸ If you really keep the royal law found in Scripture, "Love your neighbor as yourself," you are doing right. ⁹ But if you show favoritism, you sin and are convicted by the law as lawbreakers. ¹⁰ For whoever keeps the whole law and yet stumbles at just one point is guilty of breaking all of it. ¹¹ For he who said, "You shall not commit adultery," also said, "You shall not murder." If you do not commit adultery but do commit murder, you have become a lawbreaker.

¹² Speak and act as those who are going to be judged by the law that gives freedom, ¹³ because judgment without mercy will be shown to anyone who has not been merciful. Mercy triumphs over judgment.

1. **The Command** - "My brothers and sisters, believers in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ must not show favoritism." James 2:1, NIV

2. What were the Christians that James wrote to thinking:

- Fine clothes are marks of fine men while shabby clothes means shabby character.
- Wealth is a guide to the worth of a person.
- Financial standing should make a difference in acceptance in the church.
- Social and economic status are acceptable to Christ and appropriate in His church.

- 3. <u>A Truer Measurement</u> "Believers in humble circumstances ought to take pride in their high position But the rich should take pride in their humiliation." James 1:9-10, NIV
 - It is never about how much stuff we have but whether the stuff has us or Jesus has us.
 - Poor in faith is absolute poverty while rich in faith is absolute riches.
 - ²⁶ Brothers and sisters, think of what you were when you were called. Not many of you were wise by human standards; not many were influential; not many were of noble birth. ²⁷ But God chose the foolish things of the world to shame the wise; God chose the weak things of the world to shame the strong. ²⁸ God chose the lowly things of this world and the despised things—and the things that are not—to nullify the things that are, ²⁹ so that no one may boast before him. ³⁰ It is because of him that you are in Christ Jesus, who has become for us wisdom from God—that is, our righteousness, holiness and redemption. ³¹ Therefore, as it is written: "Let the one who boasts boast in the Lord." 1 Corinthians 1:26-31, NIV
- 4. <u>The Royal Law</u> 'If you truly keep the royal law found in Scripture, "Love your neighbor as yourself," you are doing right.' James 2:8, NIV
 - ³⁷ Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind." ³⁸ This is the first and greatest commandment. ³⁹ And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' ⁴⁰ All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments." *Matthew 22:37-40, NIV*
 - God is after the heart. He wants all of us.
 - Every violation of the will and ways of God is a big deal.

5. The Law that Gives Freedom

- Are any of us good enough to survive judgement based on both heart and actions?
- Where does freedom come in if we have an obligation to obey?
 - We must do His will.
 - We are able to do His will.
 - We get to do His will.

Final Thoughts

- Our love for God is always going to show up in how we treat others.
- It is more than just our external actions. It is a matter of the heart.
- Christ in us will change our words and actions. It is not just an obligation. It is also an opportunity.
- God's Word is not only authority and power...it is freedom.
- ²³ Search me, God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. ²⁴ See if there is any offensive way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting. *Psalm 139:23-24, NIV*
