Big Idea:

1 Thessalonians 5:16 Rejoice always,

Sermon Notes

For Reflection and Application:

Monday:

Read 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18. How would you evaluate yourself on the three commands given? How does it make you feel?

Tuesday:

In 1 Thessalonians 5:18, what does "in Christ Jesus" have to do with rejoicing always, praying without ceasing, and giving thanks in all circumstances? See Colossians 2:6 and John 15:1-5. What is the connection between abiding in Christ and a joyful, grateful attitude?

Wednesday:

Read 1 Thessalonians 5:19-20. How does one "quench the Spirit?" What does it mean to "despise prophecies" and what does it have to do with quenching the Spirit?

Thursday:

Read 1 Thessalonians 5:21-22. What are the types of things we are to test? What kinds of things are good? What kinds of things are evil?

Friday:

If the word of God is the fuel the Spirit uses to do his transforming work in us, what does this suggest about how we can cultivate a Christlike attitude of joy, prayer, and gratitude?

Daily Prayer:

Lord, I want to fuel the fire of the Spirit in me by reflecting deeply on the word of God. Transform me that I may rejoice always, pray without ceasing, and give thanks in all circumstances. Amen.
