Text | Lamentations 3:22-24

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Sermon Notes

Lamentations 3:22 The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; 23 they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. 24 “The LORD is my portion,” says my soul, “therefore I will hope in him.” ESV

Galatians 4:4 But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born under the law, ESV

2 Peter 3:9 The Lord is not slow to fulfill his promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance. ESV

Big Idea:

Deuteronomy 32:4 The Rock, his work is perfect, for all his ways are justice. A God of faithfulness and without iniquity, just and upright is he. ESV

For Reflection and Application:

Monday:

Read Deuteronomy 32:4. Moses here reflects on God's faithfulness. Think over your life and think of at least three ways God has been faithful in your life. Be specific!

Tuesday:

Read Galatians 4:4. How long had the world been waiting for the Messiah? What does the phrase "in the fullness of time" mean? Has God already fulfilled all of His promises? What does this verse teach about His timing? What does this imply for His unfulfilled promises?

Wednesday:

Read John 3:16. What does this famous verse promise? What does God's faithfulness mean when applied to this and other verses addressing our salvation? Does possession of eternal life now and experience of eternal life in His presence one day depend on our faithfulness or His?

Thursday:

Read 1 Corinthians 10:13. Do you ever face temptation? Should we pray and ask God to remove a temptation (yes, it is a trick question!)? What does God promise for your temptations? What should we look for when we face a temptation? Why is this not always easy?

Friday:

Read 1 John 1:9. When we give in to temptation and thus sin, what are the consequences? Based on Wednesday's reading (John 3:16), God's faithfulness applies to our salvation. Based on yesterday's reading, we know God faithfully promises a way of escape. Today's reading addresses what God provides when we sin. Much like a child who disobeys, we are not cast out of the family; instead, God provides a way to deal with the sin and restore the relationship. What is that provision? What does God promise? Are there any limits on how often we can come to Him or how serious the sin?

Daily Prayer:

Great is Thy faithfulness, O God, my Father; there is no shadow of turning with Thee. Thou changest not, Thy compassions, they fail not; as Thou hast been, Thou forever wilt be. Amen.

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
