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# Sermon Notes

Mark 10:46 And they came to Jericho. And as he was leaving Jericho with his disciples and a great crowd, Bartimaeus, a blind beggar, the son of Timaeus, was sitting by the roadside. <sup>47</sup> And when he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to cry out and say, “Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!” <sup>48</sup> And many rebuked him, telling him to be silent. But he cried out all the more, “Son of David, have mercy on me!” <sup>49</sup> And Jesus stopped and said, “Call him.” And they called the blind man, saying to him, “Take heart. Get up; he is calling you.” <sup>50</sup> And throwing off his cloak, he sprang up and came to Jesus. <sup>51</sup> And Jesus said to him, “What do you want me to do for you?” And the blind man said to him, “Rabbi, let me recover my sight.” <sup>52</sup> And Jesus said to him, “Go your way; your faith has made you well.” And immediately he recovered his sight and followed him on the way. ## Big Idea:

Mark 10:49 And Jesus stopped and said, “Call him.” ESV

## For Reflection and Application:

### Monday:

Read Mark 10:47. Why do you think Bartimaeus cried out for mercy instead of asking Jesus to simply heal him? What does this reveal about the type of relationship he wanted with Jesus?

### Tuesday:

Read Mark 10:48. What motivated the crowd to silence Bartimaeus? Can you think of times when we silence the needs of the people around us?

### Wednesday:

Read Mark 10:49. The crowd's attitude changed after they saw Jesus' positive response to Bartimaeus. Can you think of a time your attitude changed when you saw how Jesus was involved in a situation? How can we start to see God's hand in all of our interactions?

### Thursday:

What does this passage teach us about the significance of our plans vs. God's divine appointments?

### Friday:

List a few inconveniences you have experienced recently that could have been opportunities to participate in God's work.

### Daily Prayer:

Jesus, thank you for showing us your compassion for others. Open our eyes to opportunities to love others and bring your kingdom to earth.
