2 Corinthians 9:8 - "And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work."

Context and Reflection:

- Historical/Cultural Context: Paul was encouraging generous giving among the Corinthian church.
- Theological Significance: God's abundance enables both our needs and our giving to be met.
- Application: We can trust God's provision as we practice generous giving.

Pastor Keith Jenkins' message reminded us that tithing is not merely a legal obligation but a pathway to blessing and provision in God's kingdom. Through faithful giving, we participate in God's work while positioning ourselves for His abundance.
