# 5. Foundation Update - Doug Torrence

- a. As Doug will be rolling off of the Governing Board, he wanted share some parting thoughts related to the role of Governing Board liaison to the Foundation.
  - i. Designated funds should be fully utilized such as the Rose fund, Bible fund, and mission-related funds.
  - ii. The importance of following the grant submission process.
  - iii. The role of the Governing Board Liaison should be maintained going forward.

# 6. Financial Report and Update - Seth Stearns

- a. 2023 Pledges Made
  - i. \$1,872,361.68 has been pledged against a target of \$1,956,000.
- b. 2023 Pledges Paid
  - i. \$1,833,732.74 has been paid of the \$1,872,361.68 pledged.
- c. 2024 Pledges Made
  - i. \$1,663,643.48 has been pledged against a target of \$1,950,000.00.
- d. New Horizons Capital Campaign
  - i. \$2,971,575.58 has been pledged against a target of \$4,500,000.00.
- e. 2023 Financials
  - i. 2023 finished at \$75,038 in the black (with the ERC monies included)
  - ii. We finished \$60K better than the last forecast in 2023 primarily due to a surge in giving at the end of the year.
  - iii. Without the ERC monies we missed the budget by \$145K which is a 3% miss on the budget.

#### f. 2024 Budget

- i. Seth reviewed the key assumptions that served as the basis for the 2024 budget.
- ii. The 2024 budget is \$5,427,140 compared to last year's budget of \$5,192,916.
- iii. Catherine Adams made a motion that the 2024 budget be accepted.
- iv. Doug Torrance seconded the motion.
- v. An affirmative vote was unanimous.

## g. Covenant Agreement - Seth Stearns

- i. Seth Stearns presented a draft of a Covenant Agreement that is required by the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) for his commissioning process. The Board is required to vote on the agreement.
- ii. Ginney Barney moved that the Governing Board commit to and support the commissioning process as reflected in the Covenant Agreement.
- iii. Deb Humphrey seconded the motion.
- iv. An affirmative vote was unanimous.

# h. Sr. Minister's Report - Rev. Dr. Glen Miles

- i. Glen Miles referenced Dacher Keltner's book, Awe: The New Science of Everyday Wonder and How It Can Transform Your Life.
- ii. Worship attendance was up 24% over 2022.
- iii. Christmas Eve attendance was back to pre-COVID levels at over 2,700.
- iv. A renewed energy is present across the church.
- v. Dr. Andy Blosser has made it possible to have, on average, over 70 musicians across all three services leading us in worship.
- vi. The Refugee Ministry Team welcomed 24 refugees to the Columbus area last year.
- vii. Reiterated that Seth Stearns will be transitioning to the role of Minister of the Spiritual Life & Learning Center and Liz Compton will assume the role of Executive Director of Operations.
- viii. The Horizons Stewardship Report offered some very valuable information as a result of their Giving Audit.
