



### **What is the cost of rent?**

Rent for the 2026-2027 academic year is just \$700/month. Our Kingdom Collective Program Agreement is a 9-month agreement, providing stability and consistency for your school year. If you're considering summer plans, summer 2026 rent is only \$350/month (food not included) and is flexible on a month-to-month basis.

### **What does rent include?**

Enjoy the comfort of a cozy, double-occupancy room in a fully furnished dorm. Your rent covers all utilities, including Wi-Fi, and you'll have access to free on-site laundry. Plus, a limited number of single rooms may be available at an additional cost.

### **Where is the Kingdom Collective located?**

You'll find the Kingdom Collective Men's and Women's dorms at 2155 Bailey Hill Road, a short 3.8-mile drive down 18th to the U of O campus. It's the perfect mix of convenience and community!

### **What are the rooms like, and is any furniture provided?**

Think of your room as a cozy retreat! Each bedroom like a "quad" (two rooms sharing a bathroom). Each room is similar in size to an extra spacious dorm room and includes a twin bed or 2 sets of bunk beds, spacious closets, two dressers, air conditioning, heat and curtains or blinds for privacy. Our dorms also feature inviting common areas like a spacious living room, a prayer room, and a community kitchenette where friendships can blossom.
