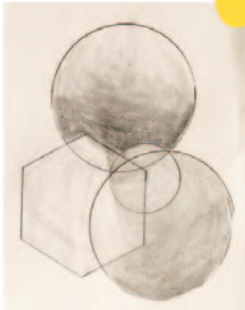
### Philadelphia Zoo

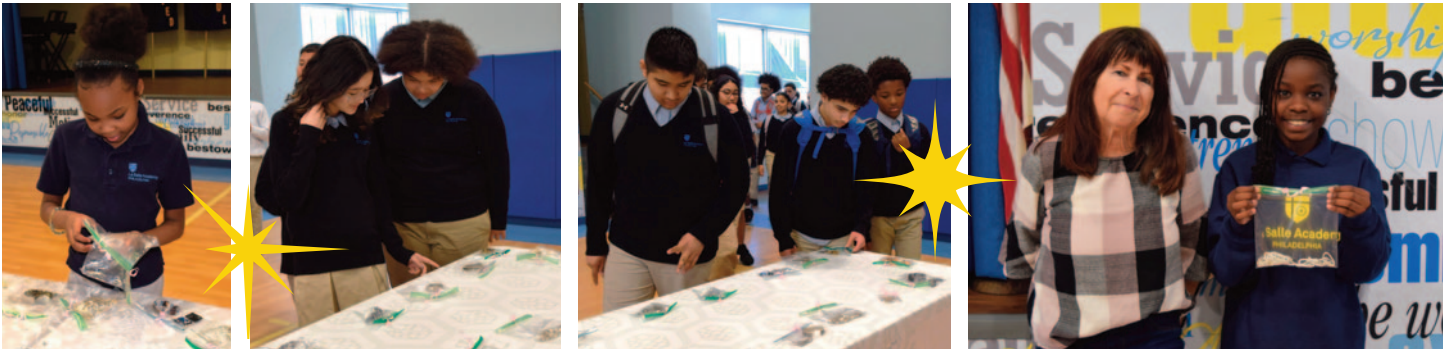

**Financial Literacy**

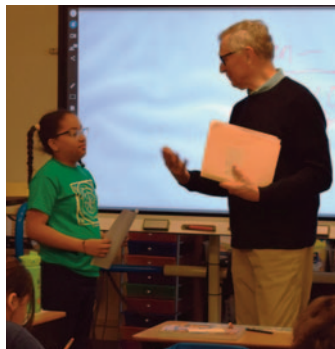
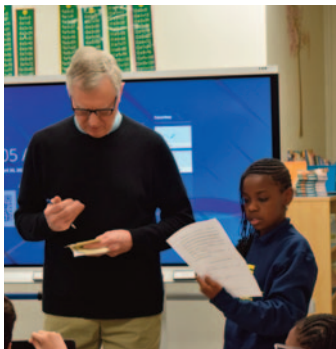
