The mission of Trinity Lutheran School is to assist families to make fully devoted followers of Jesus Christ through Christ-centered education.

The message from Pastor Ben this past weekend wasn't sugar coated, but he shared some remarkable truths with us as we looked at Matthew 2:13–23. In this account, we learn of King Herod's anger at the birth of the Messiah and the violent action he took, killing every Bethlehem boy aged two and younger. This is not a peaceful or sentimental post-Christmas scene; it is a sobering reminder that evil is real and destructive in our fallen world.

The coming King Jesus was not sheltered from fear, violence, and evil, but born directly into it. Matthew's Gospel does not allow us to deny or soften the reality of sin, but neither does it leave us without hope. As Pastor Ben shared, **the presence of suffering does not mean the absence of God.** He is Immanuel, God with us. Still.

The Gospel assures us that evil does not have the final word. As John proclaims, *"The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it"* (John 1:5). Though the coming of the King was met with opposition, God's saving plan moves forward. Even in the chaos, the Lord is at work, faithfully carrying out His purposes.

As Lutheran Christians, we confess that Christ has entered our darkness fully. He bears the weight of sin, suffering, and death, and through His cross and resurrection, He defeats them. This does not mean life will be free from hardship, but it does mean we are never without Hope.

We come before God with humility, asking Him to keep our hearts tender and watchful. We pray for eyes that see the brokenness of the world honestly, and faith that trusts God's presence even in the darkest moments. The King is coming, and nothing, not even evil itself, can stop His redemptive work. May this truth anchor your family in hope and courage this week.

Use these questions to continue the conversation at home:

- What surprised you about Jesus' early life in Matthew 2:13–23?
- Why do you think the Bible does not hide the reality of evil from us?
- How do people sometimes respond to darkness, by ignoring it or becoming used to it?
- What comfort does it give us to know that Jesus entered the darkness with us?
- Where can your family look for God's light this week?
