The mission of Trinity Lutheran School is to assist families to make fully devoted followers of Jesus Christ through Christ-centered education.

This past Sunday, Pastor Ben reflected on the baptism of Jesus in Matthew 3:13–17, a moment filled with holy tension. When Jesus comes to the Jordan River, John the Baptist hesitates. He knows who Jesus is, the sinless Son of God, and says, *“I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?”* Yet Scripture tells us, *“Then he consented.”*

John’s hesitation makes sense. Baptism was a call to repentance, and Jesus had no sin to confess. Yet, Jesus steps into the water anyway. In this moment, we see the tension between two worlds, the world as it is, broken by sin, and the world as God is redeeming it through His Son.

Jesus does not remain distant from our brokenness. He enters it fully. By being baptized, Jesus identifies Himself with sinners and begins His public ministry of bearing our sin and carrying it to the cross. We confess that Jesus’ baptism points us forward to His saving work, His obedience, His sacrifice, and His victory over sin and death.

This tension remains in our own lives. We live between what God has already done in Christ and what is not yet fully complete. Through our baptism, we belong to Christ, we are forgiven, claimed, and given new life. And yet we still struggle with sin, doubt, and weakness. We live in two worlds at once. Redeemed and still waiting, saved and still being shaped.

Paul reminds us in Romans 6:4, *“We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that... we too might walk in newness of life.”* Baptism places us firmly in God’s promises, even as we navigate the challenges of daily life.

At the Jordan, God speaks words of grace that echo for us today. *“This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.”* In Christ, those words are spoken over us as well. Not because of what we have done, but because of what Jesus has done for us. May this truth comfort your family this week. Christ has entered our world fully, claimed us as His own, and walks with us in the tension between what is and what will be.

Why do you think John the Baptist hesitated to baptize Jesus?

What does Jesus’ baptism show us about how much He loves us?

What does it mean that we live in two worlds at the same time?

How does our baptism remind us that we belong to Jesus?

Where do you see God at work in your life this week, even in the struggles?
