The mission of Trinity Lutheran School is to assist families to make fully devoted followers of Jesus Christ through Christ-centered education. Then he said to them all: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me." Luke 9:23

If you were in church on Sunday, we heard about what it means to be a **fully devoted follower of Jesus**. If not, here is a quick follow up devotion that I hope is meaningful for your family. Many people call themselves *Christians*, which is a wonderful name because it means "belonging to Christ." However, Jesus calls us to something deeper: to be His **disciples**.

A Christian is someone who trusts in Jesus Christ as Savior.

A disciple is someone who not only trusts Him, but also follows Him closely, learning from Him, obeying His Word, and living in His ways.

All disciples are Christians, but not all Christians live as disciples. Jesus wants us to be both.

Pastor Ben shared some ideas from *Practicing the Way* by John Mark Comer. In the book, Comer explains that in the time of Jesus, disciples were students who wanted to be just like their rabbi (teacher). They devoted their whole lives to three things:

- 1. **Being with your Rabbi** The first goal of a disciple was to spend as much time as possible with the rabbi. For us, this means being with Jesus daily in prayer, worship, and His Word (John 15:4–5).
- 2. **Becoming like your Rabbi** Disciples didn't just learn information; they wanted their rabbi's character and way of life to rub off on them. As disciples of Jesus, the Spirit shapes us to look more like Him in kindness, humility, grace, peace, and love (Romans 8:29).
- 3. **Doing what your Rabbi did** Disciples copied the rabbi's actions. They did this by serving, teaching, showing mercy. We follow Jesus by loving our neighbors, forgiving others, and living out our faith in word and deed (John 13:15).

Here are a few ways to practice being fully devoted followers of Jesus together this week:

**Be with Jesus**: Set aside time as a family to read the bible before bedtime.

Become like Jesus: Ask each other, "How can I show Jesus' love at school/work tomorrow?"

Do what Jesus did: Pick one way to serve someone else. You could write a note, share lunch, or pray for a classmate.

Closing Prayer Lord Jesus, thank You for calling us not only to believe in You, but also to follow You. Help us to be with You each day, to become more like You, and do the things You have taught us. Keep our hearts devoted to You above all else. Amen.
