For Such a Time as This!

This week, Pastor Lew preached on the truth that there is *a time for everything*. God's timing is always purposeful and never random. His sermon fit perfectly with something that has been weighing on my heart for several weeks.

This devotion is intentionally short, because sometimes the most important reflections come from sitting with just a few questions. During my own morning devotions, two questions stood out to me, and I haven't been able to shake them. My hope is that individually, as families, and as a community of believers, we would take time to wrestle with these questions together.

1. What would you do for the glory of God if you knew it wouldn't fail?

And then comes the harder question:

2. The moment you know the answer to that, why aren't you doing it?

Maybe it's a new career. Maybe it's serving as a missionary. Maybe it's staying in the same job, but approaching it with a renewed purpose and a Christ-centered mindset.

Paul reminds us in Colossians 3:23–24, “Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving.”

I recently heard someone put it this way: *“My prayer is that fear doesn’t hold me back—or you back. What if God speaks and we actually listen? Are we so caught up in the merry-go-round of normal life that we miss what God is doing? Life becomes: wake up, eat something, drive something, work, come home, watch something, sleep—and repeat. If our biggest prayer is simply thanking God that it’s Friday, we’re missing so much more. I pray that God turns our worlds upside down.”*

And here is the Gospel comfort in all of this: our hope does not rest on *our* courage, *our* productivity, or *our* ability to get it right. Jesus has already done the work that truly matters. He lived perfectly in our place, died for our sins, and rose again to give us new life. Because we are forgiven, loved, and secure in Christ, we are free, not afraid to serve, to listen, and to step forward in faith. Whatever season we are in, God's timing is good, and His grace is sufficient. Blessings to you and your family as you have these discussions.
