The mission of Trinity Lutheran School is to assist families to make fully devoted followers of Jesus Christ through Christ-centered education.

“This is the day that the LORD has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it.”
— Psalm 118:24 (ESV)

Over the weekend, Pastor Ben reminded us that **true joy is found in the presence of God**. Psalm 118 invites us to rejoice—not because life is always easy, but because the Lord is faithful.

In our world, we often look for joy in the things around us. We chase success, entertainment, comfort, or recognition. These things may make us happy for a moment, but they never fully satisfy. Eventually, the excitement fades and we find ourselves searching again.

The Bible shows us a deeper truth: **joy is rooted in relationship with God**. Psalm 118 repeats the phrase, *“His steadfast love endures forever.”* Our joy grows when we remember that we belong to a God whose love never runs out.

As Lutheran Christians, we know that this relationship with God is not something we earn. It is a gift given through Jesus. Through His life, death, and resurrection, Christ restores us to our Heavenly Father. Because of Jesus, we come into God’s presence with confidence and peace.

Pastor Ben shared a beautiful reminder: **our joy grows when we realize that God delights in us**. When God looks at His children—those redeemed by Christ—He is glad to see us. We are not interruptions or disappointments to Him. We are beloved members of His family.

That changes how we see each day. Joy is not something we have to chase or manufacture. It flows from knowing that God is with us. In the classroom, around the dinner table, at practice, or during busy schedules, His presence is with us.

Psalm 118 reminds us that today itself is a gift from the Lord. Whatever our circumstances may be, we can rejoice because the God who created the stars also walks with us, forgives us, and calls us His own.

Family Discussion Questions

- What are some things people often chase to try to find happiness?
- How is joy different from temporary happiness?
- Why can we be joyful even when life is difficult?
- How does knowing that God delights in you change how you see your day?

Family Prayer Heavenly Father, thank You for Your steadfast love that never ends. Forgive us for the times we look for joy in things that cannot satisfy. Through Jesus, remind us that true joy is found in Your presence. Help our family to rejoice in the gift of this day and to trust Your love in every moment. In Jesus’ name, Amen.
