	I will utter dark sayings from of old, things that we have heard and known, that our fathers have told us. We will not hide them from their children, but tell to the coming generation the glorious deeds of the Lord, and his might, and the wonders that he has done. He established a testimony in Jacob and appointed a law in Israel, which he commanded our fathers to teach to their children, that the next generation might know them, the children yet unborn, and arise and tell them to their children, so that they should set their hope in God and not forget the works of God (Psalm 78:1-8 (excerpts)

What does God want us to do? Flowing out of our reading and interpretation, what action does this passage or the Spirit's leading, call us to?

WHAT DOES GOD WANT ME TO DO?

Initiate a "story exchange" with someone younger than yourself. Focus on stories where the lessons learned were life-changing.

Consider starting a bullet-point "legacy blog" where you describe (and publish) the experiences, or the people, that/who were pivotal in your life.

What does God want ME to do? What is the personal application and action step God is calling you, personally, toward?
