- Ascetics: *Experiencing God in solitude and simplicity*
- Activists: *Connecting with God through pursuing social justice*
- Caregivers: *Seeing God by loving others*
- Enthusiasts: *Encountering God with mystery and worship*
- Contemplatives: *Communing God through adoration & prayer*
- Intellectuals: *Knowing God with the mind*
