Extra credit: Read the parable of the Laborers in the Vineyard (Matthew 20:1-16), which conclude with the words, “Am I not allowed to do what I choose with what belongs to me? Or do you begrudge my generosity?”

In what ways might you be tempted to feel resentment over the ways God has been generous to others, but not to you?

What does God want us to do? Flowing out of our reading and interpretation, what action does this passage or the Spirit’s leading, call us to?

Make a list of ten things which you value, for which you feel deep gratitude toward God for generously providing.

How does God want you to be responsibly generous in response to His goodness toward you? Do that thing this week.

What does God want ME to do? What is the personal application and action step God is calling you, personally, toward?
