Acts 19:24-28 (ESV)

<sup>24</sup>For a man named Demetrius, a silversmith, who made silver shrines of Artemis, brought no little business to the craftsmen. <sup>25</sup>These he gathered together, with the workmen in similar trades, and said, "Men, you know that from this business we have our wealth.

<sup>26</sup>And you see and hear that not only in Ephesus but in almost all of Asia this Paul has persuaded and turned away a great many people, saying that gods made with hands are not gods.

<sup>27</sup>And there is danger not only that this trade of ours may come into disrepute but also that the temple of the great goddess Artemis may be counted as nothing, and that she may even be deposed from her magnificence, she whom all Asia and the world worship."

<sup>28</sup>When they heard this they were enraged and were crying out, "Great is Artemis of the Ephesians!"

	Problem: When faith challenges tablish financial systems. (Acts 19:24-25
•	When Paul preached about Jesus, new believers stopped buying
•	This wasn't just about lost sales—it exposed the connection between spiritual and economic systems.  The real question isn't whether faith and finances will sometimes conflict—they will. The real question is which one will when they do.
П	People: When Converts Change Consumer Habits (Acts 19:26)
•	What bothered Demetrius wasn't protests but Paul teaching truth.
•	True belief changes
•	Real faith always affects our choices.
II	I. Power: When Profits Are Protected By Deception (Acts 19:27-28)
•	Demetrius wrapped his concerns in religious language.
•	He made it sound like a crisis rather than an economic one.
•	A common tactic when truth threatens established systems is to create and emotional chaos.
