

For those who have already been baptized in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, but who have never been confirmed, or the equivalent in another tradition.



What is an Anglican?

The Episcopal Church belongs to a family of churches known as the Anglican Communion. Episcopalians are Anglicans, and the Episcopal Church is the United States' member of the Anglican Communion. Episcopal and Anglican are sometimes used interchangeably.

What is an Anglican?

With 85 million members, the Anglican Communion is the third largest family of churches around the world, and the largest such Protestant group.

What is an Anglican?

With other Christians, we share a belief in the Holy Trinity, Baptism, Communion, the Apostles' Creed, and a reverence for the Bible as containing all things necessary to salvation.

What is an Anglican?

We are committed to prayer and worship, social witness, justice, peace, and reconciliation. We believe the "Earth is the Lord's and everything in it," and seek to be faithful stewards of all God has given us as we seek to build his Kingdom on earth.

Five Marks of Mission

- 1. To proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom
- 2. To teach, baptize and nurture new believers
- 3. To respond to human need by loving service
- 4. To transform unjust structures of society, to challenge violence of every kind and pursue peace and reconciliation
- 5. To strive to safeguard the integrity of creation, and sustain and renew the life of the earth



I. Scripture

Anglicans believe that God speaks to us in and through the sacred texts of the Bible.

II. Tradition

Scripture must be interpreted in the context of history and community — in conversation with those beside us and those behind us. We gain wisdom and clarity of discernment from the communion of saints across time and space.

III. Reason

We take into account human reason, science, and modern wisdom. We believe God blessed humanity with intellect.




Top 10 Reasons for Being an Episcopalian


(according to Robin Williams, that is)

- No matter what you believe, there's bound to be at least one other Episcopalian who agrees with you.






