“God, what do You want to do through me?”

This is a prayer I have prayed many a time through my ministry— earnestly seeking and heartily desiring to serve however God calls me. Sometimes the answer has put me in places and situations where I did not feel equipped or comfortable.

Sometimes it made me question my abilities or stamina.
Sometimes it has pushed me beyond my predicted limits.

But it is only when risks are taken that we find ourselves in a mode of growth.

Leviticus 25 speaks of the Year of Jubilee. This celebration of the Hebrew people occurred every fifty years, once in a lifetime, as a glimpse of God’s sabbath renewal for creation. In this practice, all debts were released. Forgiveness was granted for outstanding loans, slaves were set free and land was returned to original owners for the next generations’ profit. Jesus spoke of this Day of the Lord in his very first sermon (Luke 4:16-21), helping all to imagine the kind of world God wants for us — a life filled with forgiveness from indebtedness in mind, body and spirit.

The Year of Jubilee speaks of God’s desire for us—to be free to grow.

This is the purpose of our **Jubilee!~Free to Grow** campaign. We will live into God’s will for us to be free from debt, so that neither we, nor future generations, are weighed down with a burden that hinders the possibilities of the church. I have seen how debt stifles creativity, and I imagine new ministries possible without this weight. I know Flower Mound UMC has the capacity to be free from debt. I am convinced, as we each pray this prayer imagining a debt-free future, we will grow as a church. God’s answer to our prayer might put you in a new place financially, beyond your comfort zone, or past your anticipated limits.

But if we individually and collectively pray together:
“God, what do You want to do through me?”

I believe we can become a **Jubilee Church~Free to Grow!**

Reducing Debt

Why does reducing debt matter?

Thanks to the generosity of church members, our current debt has been paid down by \$953,000 in the last five years. This is outstanding progress and has decreased our loan balance from \$3.9 million in 2018 to \$2.9 million in 2024. What a powerful witness our church has already made in our journey to be freed from the burden of debt that reduces our ability to do ministry! Currently 14% of our entire \$1.4 million annual budget is required for interest payments alone. In 2025, we will be required to pay principal and interest if we are not in an active capital campaign for debt reduction. This campaign reduces our interest cost as we reduce our principal balance. Therefore, ministry dollars will start to be available before the three-year campaign is completed.

Starting in June 2024, some dollars will be freed for ministry, however, the fullness of freed funds will be available over the course of the three-year period. The Finance Team and Church Council will determine how these funds will be allocated and needs prioritized. These decisions will be communicated to the congregation and any church member is welcome to attend the monthly Church Council and Finance Team meetings.

Who is our mortgage lender?

Our mortgage lender is Texas Methodist Foundation (TMF), the principal lender for Methodist churches in Texas, due to their flexibility and commitment to church growth and ministry success. They have allowed us to pay interest only while other banking alternatives would not have offered that flexibility.

What are our mortgage terms?

The details of the mortgage are:

- 1) The balance is approximately \$2.9 million.
- 2) The note matures in 18 years (2042).
- 3) The annual interest rate increased in 2024 from 3.95% to 7%. Annual interest payments increased from \$120,000 in 2023 to \$203,000 in 2024.
- 4) We have a variable mortgage rate that can be renegotiated periodically for the most favorable rate.
- 5) Our current annual payments would be \$291,300 with principal and interest.

Why is our interest rate going up?

Unlike your typical home loan, TMF mortgage rates are not locked for the duration of the loan. An adjustable rate mortgage is the industry standard for church loans. TMF offers floating, 3 and 5 year terms, as well as allowing no-cost renegotiation at the church's discretion as interest rates change. The reason our interest rate increased is because our three-year term expired in a season where market rates are high. The Finance Team continues to monitor the interest markets to ensure the most favorable option for FMUMC.

Frequently Asked Questions

Who decided to move forward with this campaign?

Our Finance Team and Church Council unanimously recommended and approved we undergo this campaign.

Where will money go and who decides how it is spent?

Money saved over time will be invested in growing our church through our children, youth, adult, missions and music programs, and campus maintenance. Our Finance Team, in collaboration with our Church Council, will prioritize how these funds are redirected as they are available.

How is this different from the annual budget campaign?

Our annual stewardship campaign in the fall funds the church budget. The Jubilee campaign reduces debt on our building loan in order to grow our ministry potential. We ask your Jubilee gift be a gift beyond your annual stewardship pledge, not as a substitute.

What happens if we don't raise all the money?

No matter how much we raise, it will reduce our mortgage principal, and significantly lower our principal and interest payments going forward.

What are the financial expectations of the congregation?

Every household in our congregation is invited to pray, **"God, what do You want to do through me?"** As we each pray, discern and commit our individual part, our collected sacrifice will fulfill this campaign vision. Gift size will vary numerically by household, according to financial situation, and God's guidance.

How will commitments be requested?

A commitment card will be mailed the week of April 22, and you are asked to respond between April 28 - May 12 offering your three-year sacrificial gift.

In this campaign, we are to consider how we might give over and beyond our regular giving. We ask that you lean in and invest in our church family and continued ministry. Let's all ask ourselves, "God, what do You want to do through me?" What will it look like when we are free to grow? We think it's pretty exciting! Don't you?


