



All Saints' Sunday, November 3: Generosity

"You will be enriched in every way for your great generosity, which will produce thanksgiving to God through us, for the rendering of this ministry not only supplies the needs of the saints but also overflows with many thanksgivings to God."

--Apostle Paul, Second Letter to the Corinthians 9: 11-12

With the conclusion of each Sunday Service, I have the privilege of offering a benediction. Its Latin roots mean "a good word," and its meaning is equivalent of a blessing. In fact, when the Book of Genesis states "And God saw that it was good" or "very good" it can be understood to mean

"And God blessed it." Our story is one of original blessing, as the rich Celtic faith heritage has long taught. God blessed the world and everything in it, and each Sunday during the benediction, I remind us that we are blessed by God not for our benefit alone, but to be a blessing to the world. This is a joyful and sobering Biblical truth.

On All Saints' Sunday, this is an important message. The saints who stirred our spirits and inspired us were generous with their time, talent, and treasure. I have had the immense pleasure of officiating their Memorial Services and learned about the ways they served as Elders on Session, Deacons, Trustees, and committee chairs. On All Saints' we also honor the living saints who have been longtime members, and like the saints who have gone before them, I heard about their generosity, too. The ways they mentored youth into faith, fed and clothed those struggling with poverty, led Bible Study not only in our congregation but with returning citizens putting their life together again after prison. And I learned about the ways they helped launch Accent Pontiac and raised funds to address poverty in places far as Haiti, Belize, and Nicaragua. They were loving like Jesus.

This generosity, the Apostle Paul says in his Second Letter to the church in Corinth, is an act of thanksgiving, a response to God's many blessings and amazing grace. What you may not know is his appeal to help the poor in Jerusalem who were suffering was the first global Christian stewardship program with weekly offerings. It was Gentile churches supporting the Jewish ones, challenging the temptation to division. Paul is reminding us, as he did the Corinthians in his day, of God's great generosity. To be generous was to love like Jesus.

God's generosity through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, to us individually and collectively is not intended to swell us with pride and privilege. Instead, it is to teach us that we are to share the abundance God has given us as a blessing to others. When we share who we are and what we have, hurts are mended, and hearts are opened. The heart that loves generously, indeed, is the heart that changes the world.





Music Notes

The Prayer for Illumination sung today is based on an Arabic tune found in the *Book of Spiritual Hymns for Evangelical Churches*, published in Beirut, Lebanon, in 1965. The source of the tune is unknown. Marilyn Biery set the tune to a traditional Prayer for Illumination found in the *Book of Common Worship* published by the Presbyterian Church USA (1993).

The "Cantique de Jean Racine" (Chant by Jean Racine), Op. 11, was composed for mixed choir and organ by Gabriel Fauré (1845-1924). The text, "Verbe égal au Très-Haut" ("Word, one with the Highest"), is a French paraphrase by the dramatist Jean Racine (1639-1699) of a Latin hymn from the breviary for matins, Consors paterni luminis. The nineteen-year-old Fauré set the text in 1864–65 for a composition competition at the École Niedermeyer de Paris, and it won him the first prize. The work was first performed the following year in a version with strings and organ. The style shows similarities with his Requiem.

"The Call" is from the *Five Mystical Songs* by English composer Ralph Vaughan Williams (1872–1958), written for baritone between 1906 and 1911. The work sets four poems by seventeenth-century Welsh poet and Anglican priest George Herbert (1593–1633), from his 1633 collection *The Temple: Sacred Poems*. While Herbert was a priest, Vaughan Williams himself was an atheist at the time he wrote this set (he later settled into a "cheerful agnosticism"), though this did not prevent his setting of verse of religious inspiration.

The choral response is a traditional Arabic greeting with music written by Richard Bruxvoort Colligan in 2004. It can be found in our hymnal, #448.
