# A Note from Pastor Jasmine

The PC(USA) official logo has more to it than initially meets the eye. Of course it is in the shape of a cross, but there are other symbols represented: A dove, a chalice, an open Bible, the fires of the Holy Spirit, etc. The dove and fire are especially useful to consider today as we focus on God the Holy Spirit. In today's Scripture the Spirit is defined as a Comforter / Paraclete, and the dove reminds us of that peace and tranquility. The fires remind us of Pentecost, and the way the Holy Spirit alighted upon each person gathered and gave them the fire within to live out their

calling. As we ordain and install a new class of Deacons, Elders, and Trustees today, we are reminded that the Holy Spirit is upon each one of us. We mark today's service with red paraments and stoles as the color of ordination and installation, as a reminder of the Holy Spirit's presence with us as we fulfill our calling.

Ordaining and installing our leaders is not just about them as individuals, however. Our denominational literature says, "Occasions of ordination and installation have to do more with the ministry of the whole church than with any individual... The entire congregation [is] affirmed in their baptismal calling to discipleship and service." Our sacramental identity is solidified today as we partake in communion together. As John Calvin said, "The sacraments properly fulfill their office only when the Spirit, that inward



teacher, comes to them, by whose power alone hearts are penetrated and affections moved and our souls opened for the sacraments to enter in." Let us pray that the Spirit opens us to the calling before us as we follow Christ into servant leadership.







# **INFORMATION ON TODAY'S SERVICES**

**About the Music:** During the month of February, we highlight compositions and arrangements by Black composers. Samuel Coleridge-Taylor (1875-1912) was a British composer who earned great acclaim during his lifetime. By 1896, Coleridge-Taylor was already earning a reputation as a composer. He was later helped by Edward Elgar, who recommended him to the Three Choirs Festival. His "Ballade in A minor" was premiered there. His early work was also guided by the influential music editor and critic August Jaeger of music publisher Novello; he told Elgar that Taylor was "a genius."

Moses George Hogan (1957 – 2003) was an American composer, pianist, conductor, and arranger of choral music, including spirituals. His works are celebrated and performed by high school, college, church, community, and professional choirs. Over his lifetime, he published 88 arrangements for voice, including eight solo pieces. He died from a brain tumor at the age of forty-five.

The processional hymn, "Come Down, O Love Divine," is traditionally sung on the Day of Pentecost; it is sung today as Pastor Jasmine Smart preaches on the Holy Spirit. Little is known about the author of this text, Bianco da Siena (b. circa 1350; d. Venice, Italy, circa 1434). The hymn was translated into English by Richard Frederick Littledale (1833-1890) who studied at Trinity College in Dublin, then received multiple degrees from Oxford. The tune, named DOWN AMPNEY, comes to us from the eminent British composer Ralph Vaughan Williams (1872-1958). He named the tune after the Gloucestershire village of his birth. When Vaughan Williams died in 1958, "Come Down, O Love Divine" was sung at his funeral in Westminster Abbey as the composer's ashes were ceremonially interred in the Musicians' Corner.
