#### **Read** Colossians 1:19-23

Reconcile to change or exchange; to completely bring back into full harmony, to restore - a change in relationship

#### The plan of our reconciliation Vs 20-21

- 1) The who & what: His entire creation Genesis 3:17-19; Romans 8:20-22
- 2) The why:
  - ✓ We were estranged from God Ephesians 2:12
  - ✓ We were enemies of God Romans 8:7
  - ✓ We were engaged in evil against God John 3:19-20

### The process of our reconciliation Vs 20b, 22a

- 1) Christ died as our sacrifice John 10:17-18; 1 Peter 2:24
- 2) Christ died as our substitute Romans 8:3; 5:6-11; 3:25-26 (NCV)

## The <u>purpose</u> of our reconciliation Vs 22b

- 1) He makes us <u>upright</u> Ephesians 1:4 & 2 Corinthians 5:19,21
- 2) He makes us unblemished Hebrews 9:14
- 3) He makes us unimpeachable Romans 8:33; Revelation 12:10; Colossians 3:10; 2 Corinthians 3:18

# The <u>proof</u> of our Reconciliation Vs 23

- 1) We are continuing in our faith 1 John 2:19; Philippians 2:12-13
- 2) We are <u>certain</u> & <u>centered</u> 1 Corinthians 15:58
- 3) We are **consistent** Philippians 1:27
- 2 Corinthians 5:17-21

### **Our Response:**

- 1) What does "making peace through the blood of His cross" teach us about the seriousness of sin and the need for atonement?
- 2) How is the believer declared "holy and blameless" before God, and why is this only possible through Christ?
- 3) How is being "free from accusation" different from being sinless
- 4) How does understanding that reconciliation is by God's grace, not human effort, affect the way you forgive others or yourself?
- 5) Why is steadfastness in faith & continuing in hope of the gospel essential for those who have been reconciled to God?
- 6) How and with who can you actively share the message of reconciliation with someone who is far from Christ?
