ELIJAH STEPS INTO THE FRAY

- 1) Elijah’s nation**
- 2) Elijah’s name** – My God is Yahweh or the Lord is my God
- 3) Elijah’s nature** – Ezekiel 22:30; James 5:17
- 4) Elijah’s call** Ezekiel 33:29, 33
