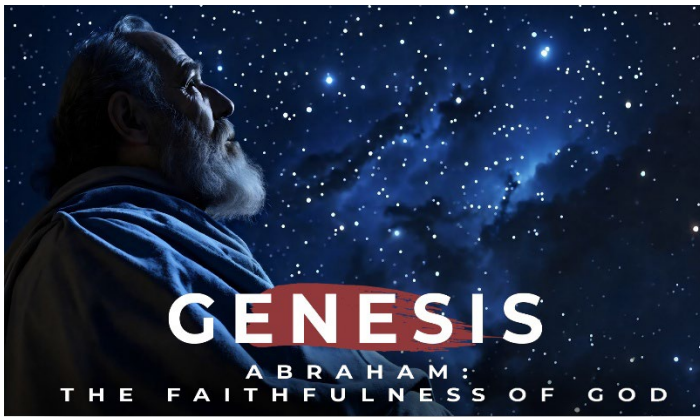

Truths for Transformation

1) A Crisis of Faith Vs 10

His calling is challenged by his circumstances

2) A Choice to Consider Vs 11-13

His choice was courage or cowardice

3) The Circumstances & Compensation Vs 14-16

He was compensated but it would later bring great complications

4) The Consequences & Correction Vs 17-20

He compromised his faith & caused harm to others

Takeaways for Today

- 1) We need to stay where God leads us until He tells us to move.
- 2) We must not rely on human wisdom, what seems best, or resort to our own devices, but instead rely on God's Word and His truth.
- 3) We must confess we usually don't disbelieve God but forget how great God truly is.
- 4) We mustn't assume just because things go well that God is blessing where we are going or what we are doing.
- 5) We should consider our choices & the consequences they may have for those around us as we seek to follow the Lord.
- 6) We need to thank the Lord He is always faithful even when we are unfaithful and He promises to always work it out for our good.

Response Questions

- 1) What “famine” (trial/test) have you faced or are currently facing that has challenged your faith?
- 2) When circumstances become difficult, is your first response to trust God or take matters into your own hands? Share a time when you did both and how that played out in your life.
- 3) How does fear or doubt affect your ability to make wise and godly decisions?
- 4) Abram tried to control the outcome by developing his own plan. Where or how are you tempted to manage circumstances instead of trusting God?
- 5) Why should you never assume that prosperity or success automatically means God's approval? What are some things you can gain materially while actually losing spiritually?
- 6) Where is God calling you today to correct a compromise, face a fear, or trust Him rather than trying to control the circumstances yourself?
- 7) God intervened despite Abram’s failure. What does this teach you about the difference between God’s faithfulness and my faithfulness?
