SUNDAY

EUCHARIST

At the Holy Eucharist, also called “Holy Communion,” we celebrate Jesus’ last supper with his disciples. This sacred meal rests at the heart of our Sunday worship services, described below.

8:00 a.m.

Sunday mornings begin at 8:00 a.m. with our Rite I service in the chapel. There is no music at this 45-minute service, which includes a short message, prayers, scripture readings and communion.

9:00 a.m. & 11:15 a.m. **(or one 10:00 a.m. service in summer)**

The 9:00 a.m. and 11:15 a.m. worship services follow a similar order of worship (Rite II). At 60-70 minutes, these services feature timely preaching and timeless music, with pipe organ, congregational hymns and anthems offered by our choirs.

5:00 p.m.

The Welcome Table is a service set in the round with a contemplative and more informal style. There is lots of singing, stillness and an opportunity to share a meal afterwards in our church hall.

 - We offer a two-year program on the Old and New Testaments that fits those "tween" years.

GRADE 6

Sixth graders revisit Christian faith basics through a catechism-based curriculum after exploring scripture in grades K-5.

RITE 13: GRADE 7

Our Rite 13 class explores faith, scripture and daily life topics as our youth begin their journey to adulthood.

CONFIRMATION: GRADE 8

Confirmation class is a year-long preparation for youth to confirm their baptismal vows exploring what it means to be a person of faith in the Episcopal Church.



YOUTH MINISTRIES

GRADES 9 - 12

High school students follow a four-year sequence of the J2A and 4Ward curriculum offering an expansive study of self, spirituality and society as youth emerge into young adulthood.

As teenagers begin their high school journey we take them to rural Georgia to experience together how faith can be put into practice.



GRADE 10+ PILGRIMAGE / MISSION TRIP

Alternating year by year, youth in Grade 10 and up can embark on a week-long international pilgrimage or a domestic mission trip where they deepen their faith and broaden their horizons.



GRADES 11 - 12 URBAN IMMERSION

High school juniors and seniors help design an out-of-state urban immersion trip as they set their sights on their lives beyond high school.



YOUNG ADULTS - 20S AND 30S

The Young Adults Ministry at All Saints' meets for monthly brunches, participates in service projects supporting our unhoused neighbors and enjoys fun social events like attending a Braves baseball game or hiking. We stay connected through our group chat to plan spontaneous get-togethers and even find someone to sit with during service.
