



The Celebrant Continues

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ, and his Blood of the new covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. 



- (ii) Parishioners with Kanuga deposits will be given the option to get a refund, carry the deposit to 2025, or donate to the Diocese of Western NC for hurricane relief.
- (iii) Budget progress: final budget will be presented at the December vestry meeting.
- Simon Mainwaring shared reflections on All Saints' community care efforts, emphasizing its mission to foster belonging and unity in diversity.
- Julie Lockhart was introduced as the new Director of Stewardship and Development, bringing extensive nonprofit experience to the role.
- Andy Barnett provided an update on Pastoral Care and Core Ministries highlighting opportunities for deeper participation and community engagement.
- Louisa Merchant discussed Refugee Ministries and their ability to support, adapt, respond and advocate for refugees in this evolving political and financial environment.
- A Future of Our Block Steering Committee update discussed financial and mission-based considerations for housing and building plans, with a master plan expected by late 2025.
