## The Second Lesson | 1 Corinthians 12: 1-11

Now concerning spiritual gifts, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed. You know that when you were pagans, you were enticed and led astray to idols that could not speak. Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says "Let Jesus be cursed!" and no one can say "Jesus is Lord" except by the Holy Spirit.

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

Glory and honor and praise to you, holy and living God. To deliver us from the power of sin and death and to reveal the riches of your grace, you looked with favor upon Mary, your willing servant, that she might conceive and bear a son, Jesus the holy child of God. Pour out your Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Body and Blood of Christ. Breathe your Spirit over the whole earth and make us your new creation, the Body of Christ given for the world you have made.

In the fullness of time bring us, with all your saints, from every tribe and language and people and nation, to feast at the banquet prepared from the foundation of the world.

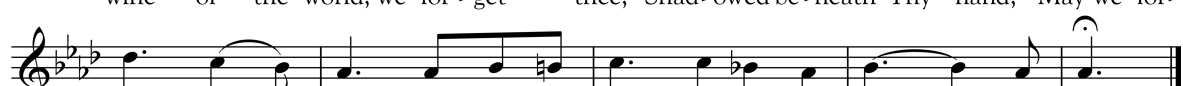

## **SUMMARY OF DECEMBER VESTRY MEETING**

*The Vestry met on Wednesday, December 18, 2024, at 4:30 PM.*

Following a meditation by Jerry Boyd, Sheldon Taylor provided the Treasurer's Report:

- (i) The Vestry noted that 2024 pledges exceeded the budget, though an operating deficit is anticipated and will be bolstered by contingency funds.
- (ii) The maintenance reserve remains significantly below the target.

Motions approving the annual clergy housing allowance and an update to the authorized check signers were passed unanimously. The 2025 budget was also approved.

The 2025 budget focuses on achieving a balanced budget, aiming to restore the pre pandemic financial status by aligning increased pledge growth with expense reductions and reallocating funds to newcomer, young adult, and children's programs. Key risks to the budget include meeting pledge goals and managing facilities expenses.

The Vestry also reviewed progress on the 2023-2026 Strategic Plan – "A Wider Circle".

Following a prayer, the meetings was adjourned.
