Through a one year program, women are provided with wraparound support and services as they gain employment, work towards financial stability, and establish a better future for themselves. FBC's financial support enables the women served by Stonebridge House to receive mental health therapy throughout their program. To date, eight women's lives have been changed as a result of being served by Stonebridge House. With additional support from our church, both through financial gifts and volunteering, Stonebridge House has the opportunity to expand their capacity to support more women in the future.
