The Season of Giving

Thanks to the generous giving of our congregation, First Baptist Church has been a dedicated supporter of Love Columbia, sponsoring an Extra Mile House and now transitioning to support their new program, Love Forward Homes. Additionally, FBC supports The Wardrobe at Love Columbia, where community members in need can receive clothing and shoes free of charge.

In 2021, Christine Chang & Donna Ostercamp began leading FBC's partnership to sponsor a transitional home for families experiencing housing instability or homelessness. To date, nine families have lived in our "little yellow house," including nine moms and 34 total children. Our church's financial support covers the utilities for the home, and countless members have helped clean, maintain, and furnish the home each time a new family moves in. Loving, personal touches for the families have also been a hallmark, with Norma Baker making a quilt and Sandy Taylor making stockings for each child that has lived in the house.

As we transition to the Love Forward Homes program, with additional support from our church, both through financial gifts and volunteering, we'll have the opportunity to make even more personal connections with the families living in our little yellow house.

<u>Intergenerational Advent - Begins Sunday, November 30 at 4 pm</u> Sharing shapes our faith.

We grow alongside one another when we listen deeply, share our stories, and make space for the experiences of others. This Advent, we are practicing that together through an intergenerational small group using the *Will to Dream* curriculum. This resource works best when upper elementary students, youth, and adults participate together in shared conversation. Even so, we welcome all ages to take part in ways that are meaningful for them. Childcare will be available for those who need it.

Our time together will focus on building relationships and learning about God from one another. Each gathering will include a sharing circle inspired by Indigenous practices often called a Talking Circle, where every person has an equal and honored voice. We will also share in hands-on activities, prayer, reflection, and songs. The season itself calls us into shared life. Elizabeth and Mary shared their experiences of pregnancy, animals shared their space, shepherds shared good news, and magi shared their gifts.

New Bible Class: Reading Responsibly in Translation

Sundays at 10:15 in the Conference Room

Consider joining us this November and early December to explore gender trouble in Scripture—what happens when we translate texts about bodies, authority, and identity. We'll start by examining translation choices, then work through biblical passages together using Elisabeth Schüssler Fiorenza's *Wisdom Ways* as our guide. (It's an older text, but it checks out). She'll have us wrestle with seven interconnected questions: How does your social location shape what you see? Whose interests does your reading serve? What does this interpretation do to us if we submit to it? What other readings are possible, and how might they transform us? I'm painfully aware my perspective is limited and shaped by privilege. The more diverse voices in the room, the richer our conversation. Bring yours.
