







In worship on Sunday, August 18, our focus was on "worry and wonder." In response to Jesus' encouragement (Matthew 6:25-34), we acknowledged our worries and turned our eyes to the birds of the air, the lilies of the field, and other experiences from our own lives to encourage our celebration of God's loving care. A globe at the front of our worship space reminded us that God's got the whole world in God's hands.

It was moving to watch members young and seasoned walk to the globe, opened on a hinge, and place slips of paper, one with words related to your worries and the other with words related to your wonder - your reflections on the ways God has shown care and blessed you. It was equally moving to sit down with those slips of paper after worship and read what you wrote. I was moved to prayer, translating my empathy for you into appeals for God's favor and my celebration with you into thanks for God's faithful love.

While respecting the private concerns that I will hold in trust, I can say something about the worries and wonders that featured most prominently. Here are some of the worries that many of us share:

- Family: Our children; our parenting; our parents; our marriages
- Money and finances making ends meet; planning for the future
- Health our own and that of people we love
- Relationships good ones, challenging ones, ones we want to have
- Work or School
- Politics the upcoming election; the divisiveness of our current political environment
- World events Ukraine; Gaza; international tensions
- The environment

As you might imagine, when it comes to wonder, many of us experience God's blessing through:

- Family and friends who mean the world to us
- Nature in its manifold expressions
- Our pets
- The gifts of rest and sleep and nourishment and good health
- Healing
- Restoration and belonging
- Feeling loved
- Answered prayers in times of financial, physical, and relational need
- The simple, profound experience of God's presence and love

Aren't you glad that we are a community of faith where love reigns, where we can share our worries and our wonders knowing that we're not alone, that we're in this together, surrounded by the love and care of God?

We know that children learn how to worship God by watching the adults they know and love worship, by participating, and by asking questions. 
Baptizing America: Fall Book Study Thursdays in October
