### Participate in the Stairlift Project

In the previous issue of the Spire, we celebrated the news that First Baptist Church trustees, with the enthusiastic support of the Church Council, have discovered a solution for the four-step accessibility



problem at the southwest entry of the sanctuary. For those with mobility issues, those steps might as well be a wide river divide. Our congregation's historic commitment to hospitality and inclusion has kept this trouble spot on the radar even as we've done significant work elsewhere to improve accessibility.

Fabrication is currently under way of a customized, retractable platform stairlift, one that lowers into place when needed and bears up to 550 lbs. The project will also include the installation of automatic door openers for the door into the sanctuary. If plans unfold as anticipated, the stairlift will be operational before the end of the year.

Total cost of the project will be \$40,400. \$24,000 has already been set aside by previous actions of the church. Members with an interest in the project are welcome to contribute toward the \$16,400 of additional funding needed.

If this project interests you, here are the primary ways you can contribute toward the cost:

**Contribute online:** Simply go to the GIVE link on church's website (fbc-columbia.org/giving) and follow its instructions for making a contribution. Be sure to specify in the MEMO box that your contribution is for the Stairlift Project.

**Write a check:** Specify on the Memo line that it's for the Stairlift Project. If mailing the check, include a cover note that designates the purpose of the contribution.

Make a cash contribution. To make sure that a designated cash contribution goes to this project, enclose the cash in an envelope and include instructions that the money is for the Stairlift Project. If you want your gift to be tax deductible, be sure to provide your name and contact information, as well.

### Advent Workshop

The word Himmeli has German and Swedish roots—emerging from the word for "sky" or "heaven" in each. Its use in the Finnish language has no translation. It is originating from the Swedish word for sky or heaven. Himmeli is a traditional Finnish ornament made from straw or reeds. It is typically suspended above the dinner table during the holiday season to symbolize Order and a Harmonious Universe. They positively influence their surroundings and people around them, and through their shape, a himmeli expresses the concept of light being reborn.

On Sunday, November 24, we will gather during the small group hour, 10:15-11 am, in the Fellowship Hall for a simple workshop to show you how to make these ornaments. All the supplies will be provided, so please join us in the fun. We will use these on our Christmas trees this Advent season in our worship spaces and hopefully in your home. ### **Dispensation of Church Owned Grave Sites**

More that 25 years ago, First Baptist was gifted several grave sites at Columbia and Memorial Park Cemeteries. The seven sites at Columbia Cemetery were donated by the Gee Family and were designated for use "by some person or persons of need." The two sites at Memorial Cemetery were donated by the Freeland Family and have no restrictions regarding their use. The Church Council has recently approved the following plan for the use of these sites.

#### **Columbia Cemetery Sites:**

First Baptist will enter into a relationship with Parker-Millard Funeral Services to provide these sites at no cost to families that have experienced the loss of an infant or young child. Parker-Millard currently has a program where they pay the full cost of a burial except for the grave site for families that cannot afford a burial and funeral service. Parker-Milard will screen for families that can benefit from this program and communicate the need to the Church. An ad hoc committee of a member of the Clergy, the Church Moderator and the Chair of the Deacons will approve the donation of the grave site. The Treasurer will work with Parker-Millard to transfer ownership.

#### **Memorial Cemetery:**

The two grave sites owned by the Church at Memorial Cemetery will be made available for sale to anyone affiliated with First Baptist at the current cost of \$3,500 per site. The proceeds from the sale of these sites will be used to purchase additional sites at Columbia Cemetery to be used for families as described above. This arrangement will end when all grave sites are used.
