Word from Pastor Kristin

First Baptist,

It is so good to finally be with you in Columbia! My welcome here has been so wonderful. The cards you wrote to greet me on my first day have really set the tone. I enjoyed reading them throughout my first week and absorbing all the kind thoughts. You have given me so many good ideas for things to do in Columbia and I look forward to trying them all! Brian and I feel at home, and we are thankful because it is you who have made that happen.

Over the next several weeks, I hope to meet with as many people as possible. We have published in this Spire a list of available days and times. Please don't hesitate to contact the church office and make an appointment during those times. If those times don't work, please suggest some good alternatives. As your pastor, my first priority is to know you. We are here to be community and family for each other. I have already experienced the warmth and welcome of FBC and I anticipate the joy of deeper relationships in the days to come.

For the next several weeks, we will be considering how God's name shapes us in our sermon series. It's odd to me how powerful a name can be. I was born Kristin Jones and became Kristin Rogers when my stepfather adopted me. We didn't have a good relationship, and the name Rogers was one that I didn't enjoy carrying. I didn't want it. But I also had no connection with any of the Jones family. It was an odd feeling of disconnection and uncertainty of where I fit in the world. When I married Brian, I happily gave up my maiden name in order to have the name McAtee which carried love and joy. A few years ago, I discovered that my birth father was not Mr. Jones, but Mr. Noble. As I met that family and encountered their love and acceptance, it gave me such powerful feelings of belonging and confidence and love. I would not have been able to put into words what having a name that represented family and love did for me until it happened. It truly changed my self-worth. For the first time, I fully appreciated genealogy in the book of Matthew and in the Old Testament. Names matter.

I hope the message you receive from this series is that you, a follower of Christ, carry the name of God. It is a name that lets you know you are loved and cared for. You exist because God exists and brought you into being. You are provided for, shepherded, and given illumination for this life. You have the right to accept or reject those names, but the welcome and offer is there for you to come and embrace the fullness of your being in God. These names don't just tell us about God's identity, but also our own. Let this be a moment of joy and self-worth.

Lenten Worship Series: Everything In Between

This year, we're letting the Gospel of Luke guide us through Lent. Beginning with Jesus setting his face toward Jerusalem (Luke 9:51), this worship series designed by A Sanctified Art, flows through several familiar stories—the Good Samaritan, Mary and Martha, the fruitless fig tree, the Lost Sheep, Zacchaeus, and more. Many of these stories are well-known in both sacred and secular imagination and hold significance in pop culture, church history, politics, and everything in between.

The theme, "Everything In Between," invites us to navigate the polarities in our lives with more faith, intention, and openness to be transformed. Each weekly sub-theme explores two supposed binaries, like "faith & works" or "rest & growth," or "grief & hope." We often consider these ideas to be opposing. However, as we explore these concepts within the scriptures, we find nuance and complexity. We find that these dichotomies are false. We might begin to see a full spectrum instead of black and white. We might find that God is present in between.

Our Lenten Journey will begin on March 5 with Ash Wednesday at 6 pm in the Fellowship Hall.


Pancake Party March 4 at 6:00 pm
