### Word from the Pastor



First Baptist,

Our Lenten series, Everything [in] Between, has been challenging. I chose the series because I think it is so important for us find the middle of the polarities that divide us. The challenge for me has been how similar some of these polarities are to one another. Intent vs Action. Faith vs Works. Rest vs Growth. If you consider these three, you may notice that intent, faith, and rest, all contain some element of rest, lack of movement, or slowing down. How many ways can we consider NOT acting? There are only so many ways to describe taking time to pray, to rest, to plan and consider our actions.

Maybe my struggle is that I find it harder to rest than to work. I'd rather do than be. In many ways, this is the story of our culture. There is a constant drive to succeed, to work harder, to produce more, to buy more, to serve more. How often do we hear ads to slow down and breathe? Who is telling us to take time for considering our situation, praying over it, and pondering our next steps? I'm realizing that I'm challenged because I need to do this better. For you, for myself, I need to hear Jesus' words of balance. Do God's good works and take time to rest. Challenge yourself and grow, then slow down to recharge for your next challenge. Set good intentions and then act on them. Let's all commit to one another to making more time for these important spiritual practices.

As I look out over my window into the courtyard, I see signs of spring. The grass is suddenly green. The tulip tree is blooming. I am so thankful to be here with you in this new season of my life. You continue to make me, and my family, feel loved and at home. We are excited to close on a new home in April. Danielle will return to us in June, after a great season at Disney. In all these transitions, we sense God at work and give thanks.

You are welcome to select one of the sites led by our First Baptist members, or choose a different one that best fits you!








# **Save the Date!** Journey Together

#### Racial Justice & Inclusion Team Book Discussion


The Spirit of Justice: True Stories of Faith, Race and Resistance

March 31 at 6pm in the Parlor

First Baptist Church's Racial Justice & Inclusion Team invites you to participate in an intergenerational discussion of Jemar Tisby's newest book, The Spirit of Justice and its companion books I am the Spirit of Justice (youth version) and Stories of the Spirit of Justice (picture book). In these books, Dr. Tisby uncovers unsung heroes who have struggled for racial justice and whose stories have inspired him in his work to enlighten and embolden people of faith to work for racial justice. It is his hope to inspire and embolden readers to step out in similar ways as we learn about these historic heroes.

The book discussion will take place in one evening but in two parts. The first hour of discussion will be for families/intergenerational with a snack break following. The second hour of discussion will be for those who wish to dive more deeply and to consider individual and collective response.

The church has ordered a limited number of complimentary copies of all three books from Black Tea Bookshop, a local minority-owned book store. About Jemar Tisby: In 2023, Dr. Tisby was FBC's guest author and speaker. He is a nationally recognized advocate for racial justice, hosts an Apple podcast called Footnotes and writes on Substack. He is a renowned historian, professor, writer and theologian who also collaborates with Diana Butler Bass, Robert Jones and Kristin Du Mez in a weekly online discussion called The Convocation.
