Self-Study Committee Update

First Baptist's Self-Study Committee is composed of Church Council members (Lynne Lampe and Julie Scroggs) and at-large church members (Kim Moeller, Ronda Wahl, and Charles Hunter). The purpose of this committee is to gather information and feedback from the congregation regarding First Baptist's values, needs of the church, and qualities desired in the next Pastor. The information gathered will be put into a report for the Pastor Search Committee to use to inform their search and create the Church Profile. The Self-Study Committee is meeting weekly to discuss the next steps regarding the best ways to gather your feedback. What you can expect from our committee are regular updates and announcements regarding a survey and town halls, which will occur this winter. Our goal is to complete the survey, town halls, and report by the end of February.

Interim Senior Pastor Search Committee Update

We wanted to update you on what's been happening with our search for an Interim Sr. Pastor. First, our committee has been hard at work crafting a job description for the Interim Sr. Pastor role. We've sent it out to our denominational partners. We're also gathering information about specific pastors who have served as interim pastors in our region. This will help us better understand who might be the best fit for our congregation. We've developed a set of questions we plan to use during the interview process with potential candidates. It's all about finding the right person who has the skills and shares our values and vision.

An important note: there's a national trend of fewer individuals available to serve as interim pastors. It seems that most of the candidates are either recently retired or planning to retire soon. In light of this, we're open to being flexible with some of the responsibilities and the number of days per week a candidate needs to be on-site. Our main goal is to find the best match for our church. Our hope is that we can have an interim pastor in place by the first quarter of 2024. We know this is an important step for our church, and we're committed to making it happen. If you have any questions or thoughts, please don't hesitate to reach out to any of us on the committee. We're here to listen and work together to find the best interim pastor for our church.
