It is that time of year again! With the holiday season right around the corner we hope you will help us support the good work of Voluntary Action Center's (VAC) holiday program this season. VAC is one of our longstanding local ministry partners. This non-profit exists to help low-income individuals and families bridge the gap between crisis and stability and improve quality of life in Boone County. Each year VAC coordinates the collection and distribution of food and gifts for approximately 4,000 people during the holiday season. This year, First Baptist is sponsoring 14 individuals across 3 families to help support this work.

On Sunday, November 19, Christmas "wishes" for individuals will be posted on the bulletin board in the hall between the worship spaces. You can get involved by choosing an item that you would like to purchase and donate, take the card, then return the purchased item to the church by December 3. Items must be brought in by the 3rd as they will be delivered to VAC on Monday, December 4 to be distributed to families. Please do not wrap items but do secure the card from the bulletin board to your gift.

If you do not have time to shop but still want to participate, you can make a monetary donation by December 3. Simply indicate "VAC Family Christmas" on your check or offering envelope.
