Luke 10:25-37**

Advent Worship Series – Beginning December 1

Advent is a season of endings and beginnings. As the calendar year comes to an end, a new church year begins. Christ's birth ushers us into new ways of living and loving; and yet, the world as we know it spins madly on. In many ways, pregnant Mary was surrounded by endings—large and small, personal and political. But Mary proclaimed hope in a God who was and is making all things new. Christ's birth offered a beautiful new beginning for shepherds and Magi alike—all the while, King Herod tried to bring Christ's story to an end. When we ourselves navigate seasons filled with endings and beginnings, we need reminders. We need words that can feel like steady ground, like a path for our feet to find as we step forward into the unknown. *Words for the Beginning* offers us scriptures and reminders we need to hear again and again as we begin a new season rooted in love.

Our Advent theme was inspired by the storied tradition of quilting. The visual concept of quilting inspired us because this series feels like a blanket wrapped around you, providing warmth and comfort as you begin again. Pastoral Search Committee Update

The pastoral search committee is excited to announce a candidate to the church for the position of Senior Pastor. The pastoral call visit will occur the weekend of Sunday December 08, 2024, with combined worship at 11:15 followed by a special called business meeting and luncheon. Throughout the weekend, the candidate will meet with different teams and committees, and Saturday evening, December 7th, the pastor search committee will host a reception and dinner for the entire congregation from 4-7 PM in the fellowship hall. This event will include a receiving line for each person to meet the candidate and her family and following dinner, the candidate will share her spiritual journey and participate in a Q&A session. To protect the confidentiality of the candidate at this time we will not be sharing the candidate's name today. The Sunday before the call visit, December 1, the search committee will present the candidate's name and a resume will be provided, and additional details will be shared in a letter to the congregation and through the Spire. To protect the confidentiality of the candidate we ask that you keep communication about the candidate within our church family. Overall, the pastor search committee wants to express its deep appreciation to the congregation for its prayers, support and patience during this process. We believe the Holy Spirit has been guiding and leading our church, staff, pastor search committee, and the candidate to bring us to this point.
