The Bible: Mining Many Messy Meanings (Bible, MMMM.)

Join Henry Imler for six weeks of (hopefully) honest wrestling with questions many Baptists wonder about but might not always discuss openly. What makes a text "sacred"? Who decided what went in the Bible and what is the difference between translations anyway? Can it be sacred without being perfect? What all is in there? We'll explore how our shared sacred text pushes back against empire, deals with translation problems, and what it might mean to stay in a tense relationship with a text that sometimes troubles us. The first session will be held Sunday, September 7, in the Conference Room on the second floor.

Nominating Committee Update

As we look ahead to next year and pursue our vision of co-creating a restorative community of fully inclusive followers of Jesus, we are inviting individuals to serve on our Ministry Teams. The Nominating Committee will soon begin reaching out to current team members to confirm their interest in continuing to serve. We'll also be contacting potential new members to join the teams. Trustee Recommendation Approved by Church Council

The Trustees have requested a group be formed to examine the current and future ministry needs of our congregation and how the interior spaces of our church can better serve those needs. It is time again to undertake a thoughtful and prayerful assessment of how our spaces align with our ministry goals. The Trustees recommend assembling a group that brings together a mix of voices — including ministry leaders, facilities experts, and congregational representatives — to evaluate how our interior spaces are currently used, what is needed to support effective ministry, and what options we might consider to address the condition and functionality of our buildings. This is an opportunity not only to address urgent facility concerns but also to imagine how our buildings might better support the ministry of this congregation in the years ahead. This team will take into account the good work done in years past to seek solutions as they consider both ongoing and new building issues. Pastor Kristin will work with the Trustees to assemble a team of people for this process.

Third Pastor Candidate Announced!

The Third Pastor Search Committee is pleased to present Joseph (Joey) Fuson as the Pastor for Youth and Community Ministries Candidate. Joey holds an MDiv from Wake Forest School of Divinity and comes to us with extensive experience in youth ministry. He recently completed a year's training in Clinical Pastoral Education, giving him a wider experience in ministry. Joey visited with staff, youth, parents, youth leaders, and members of the Serving Team last weekend. Our goal was to discern if Joey would fit into our church and for Joey to discern his calling to be here. After this discernment process, we are pleased to say that we have offered the position to Joey, contingent upon the approval of the church.

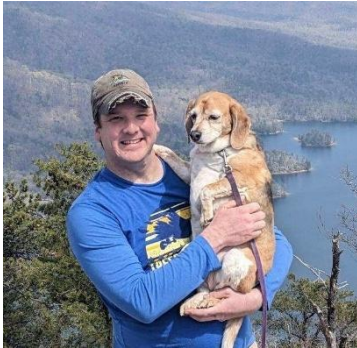

Joey comes to us from Greenville, SC. He was born in Jacksonville and brought his fandom of the Jaguars with him to Greenville, where he spent the bulk of his life. He double majored in Religion and Political Science, which along with several

meaningful extracurricular activities led him to a call to ministry. His interests include spending time at his local board game store, hiking, and spending time with his dog, Jenny.

The committee was most interested in Joey's experience with youth. Through multiple internships and full-time youth ministry, he has worked in a variety of settings, from inner-city to rural. His theology is very progressive, and he identifies strongly with the Alliance of Baptists. His references speak highly of his people skills and his outgoing personality. His former pastor told us if he were looking for a youth pastor, Joey would be one of his top candidates. Joey is an experienced preacher, teacher, and minister. We believe that he will grow with us and help us to grow as well.
