When the time came for Elizabeth to have her child, she gave birth to a boy. Her neighbors and relatives celebrated with her because they had heard that the Lord had shown her great mercy. On the eighth day, it came time to circumcise the child. They wanted to name him Zechariah because that was his father's name. But his mother replied, "No, his name will be John." The child grew up, becoming strong in character. He was in the wilderness until he began his public ministry to Israel.

We know that while the holiday season is full of cheer and expectation, many also hold grief and sadness. As a way to make space for difficult emotions during the holiday season, particularly grief around endings and anxiety around new beginnings, you are invited to a contemplative Blue Christmas service on December 21. Our service will provide space for silence, prayer, and lament.

Rooted in Abundance, Tending Generosity

We ask you to prayerfully consider your giving for next year. We know this is a personal and sensitive matter, but it is also a spiritual discipline. Pledge cards are available for you to record your commitment. *You can turn in your pledge anonymously*. We encourage all to make a pledge as a prayerful practice, and as a way to help our church practice good stewardship. Cards can be placed in the offering plates.



Online Giving Fees and Options

There were several questions at the recent Church Business Meeting related to various methods of giving available to Church members and others. Currently, the most popular method is to give online using the service offered through the Church website. This service is named Amplify (previously e360Giving) and it provides several options including one-time or on-going giving, the use of credit or debit cards or the use of Google Pay, PayPal, Venmo or a direct withdrawal from your checking account. All of these methods result in a 2.5% fee, based on your donation, charged to the Church. The service does offer the option for you to pay this fee for the Church, thus increasing your payment by the 2.5% fee.

There are other methods, however, that avoid all fees and are just as convenient for you and the Church. Most online banking services offer a check writing service at no charge. Using this method, you can set up a recurring withdrawal that results in a paper check being sent to the Church. You can also set up an Electronic Fund Transfer (EFT) through your bank. Please know that there is no preferred method. All donations, in any form, are greatly appreciated.
