Maundy Thursday – April 2

The Liturgical Arts Team invites you to a self-directed experience from 6 pm to 7pm on Maundy Thursday. This intergenerational event invites you to multiple interactive experiences that invite participation in the Lent experience and a personal experience with the story. Foot or hand washing will be available. This will be held in the Sanctuary.

Ecumenical Good Friday Observance – April 3

Downtown churches are invited to gather at noon on April 3rd, Good Friday. We honor the importance of worshiping together during challenging times. This solemn service will be held on the lawn of First Baptist Church, 1112 E Broadway. Together in the noise and movement of a busy city we will seek to center ourselves and reflect on Jesus' sacrifice for us. **Our annual observance of Good Friday will be at 6pm in the Fellowship Hall.**

Easter Vigil – Saturday, April 4

Join us Holy Saturday at 6pm for a special Easter Vigil service in the sanctuary in which we will observe mindfulness of Jesus' death through candle lighting, thoughtful meditation, and chanting. This brief service is intended to help us find an attitude of solemnity before celebration during the hours between the sunset of Holy Saturday and the sunrise of Easter morning.

Small Group Opportunities in Lent

Making Space: Everything seems so big in the world right now: too much, too heavy, too fast and too draining. It's difficult to find space and have that space held for everything we are experiencing in our shared lives. Using the book *For Such a Time as This: An Emergency Devotional* by Hanna Reichell, we will be reading a chapter aloud and discussing it as we hear it and process it together.

Rest & Reflect: Gather Sunday mornings at 10:15 am in the Green Room to practice guided meditation and reflection on the Scripture. Through silence, journaling, and calm we will center ourselves on what God is saying to us. Make space and time for this practice in your Lent.

Entering the Passion of Jesus: In support of our church-wide Lenten study, “Entering the Passion of Jesus: A Beginner's Guide to Holy Week”, the Discussion Class invites all to join us in a six-week study designed to provide additional insight as we discuss the book in more depth than it would be possible to do during a sermon. We welcome you to bring your curiosity, your questions, and the uniqueness that only you can add to our group. We meet Sunday mornings between services (10:15-11:00) in the Parlor, which is on the second floor of the education building. We will start this class on February 22nd.
