

SEARCH for Rocks

Go on a rock hunt. Point out the elements of nature and remind your child that David gave Mephibosheth lots of land (see reverse side). Choose a rock to take inside. With a permanent marker, write the word *KIND* on the rock. Keep it in a place where it can be easily seen. Use the rock as a reminder to talk about kindness with your child.

SET a Table

Invite your child to help set the table for a meal. Talk about the Bible story (reverse side). Mention that Mephibosheth ate at the king's table every day. Say a prayer before the meal, thanking God for giving us good food to eat.

DELIVER FOOD and Clothing

Collect and deliver food and clothing to a food bank or your church's food pantry with your baby. Tell your baby that David promised to take care of Jonathan's family

(see reverse side). Comment that David gave Mephibosheth many lands and had him eat at his table. Thank God that you can help people by giving your food and clothes.

David Helped Mephibosheth

WEEKLY VERSE: Be kind to one another. *Ephesians 4:32*

LIFE POINT: People can choose to love and be kind.

Jonathan had a son named Mephibosheth (meh FIB oh sheth). Mephibosheth's feet were hurt.

When David became king, he wanted to know if anyone in Jonathan's family was still alive. He asked Ziba (ZIGH buh), one of Saul's servants: "Is anyone left in Jonathan's family? God has been kind to me. I would like to be kind to someone in the same way."

Ziba answered, "Jonathan's son, Mephibosheth, is still living. Both of his feet were hurt." So, King David had Mephibosheth brought to his palace.

King David said, "Do not be afraid. Your father, Jonathan, and I were good friends. I will be kind to you. I will always give you what you need." King David gave Mephibosheth all the land that had belonged to his grandfather, Saul. Mephibosheth thanked the king for being kind to him.

Then King David sent for Ziba. He said to Ziba, "You and your family must take care of the land I am giving to Mephibosheth. Grow food on the land." King David took care of Mephibosheth and treated him as one of his own sons.

Samson

JUDGES 13; 15:1-5; 16

An angel spoke to Samson's parents before Samson was born. The angel said, "Your son will be set apart for God's service. You must never cut his hair. He will deliver Israel from the hand of the Philistines."

When Samson was grown, he took a young goat and went to visit his wife, but her father had given away Samson's bride to another man. Samson angrily burned the Philistines' fields of grain and olive groves.

Later Samson traveled to the city of Gaza. The people heard Samson was in Gaza, so they planned to ambush him at the city gate. Samson took hold of the doors of the city gate along with the two gateposts, pulled them out, and put them on his shoulders.

Some time later, Samson fell in love with a woman named Delilah, who lived in a Philistine region. Each Philistine leader offered Delilah 1,100 pieces of silver if she could tell them the secret of Samson's great strength.

Delilah begged Samson several times for the secret to his strength. Finally, Samson gave in. "My hair has never been cut," he admitted. "It is the source of my strength."

When Samson fell asleep, Delilah called a man to cut his hair. Then she cried out, "Samson, the Philistines are here!" The Philistines captured Samson because God had left him and took away his strength. The Philistines overpowered him, blinded him, and forced him to grind grain in prison.

The Philistines gathered in their temple to honor their false god. "Our god has handed over our enemy!" the Philistines said. They called for Samson to be brought out so they could make fun of him.

Samson braced himself against the pillars of the temple. He prayed, "God, remember me. Strengthen me just once more." Samson pushed with all his strength, and the temple collapsed. As Samson died, he killed more Philistines than he had during his life.
