2. Read **Exodus 9:1-7, 10:21-23**, and **2 Samuel 22:29**. Pastor Tom shared how God uses His power precisely and justly to "both comfort and confront, encourage and challenge, rebuke and restore simultaneously in the right people's lives." Which of these phrases describes how God is working in and through you now? Explain.
3. Read **Exodus 8:16-19**. God's power is unmatched. How does God's unmatched power give you unique perspective when facing life experiences?
4. Read **Numbers 11:29b** and **Ephesians 5:18**. God invites you to be filled with His Holy Spirit and rely on His power. What obstacles or attitudes do you need to surrender to God to embrace this invitation?
5. As a group, pick a time to remind one another to be filled with the Holy Spirit each day this week (via text, group chats, etc.). Then, at your next group session, unpack how the week went and your takeaways from the experience.
